**Purpose:** The purpose of this memo is to provide a rationale for the proposed fee increases for FY2017/18.

**Background:** TRU reviews its tuition fees annually. The BC Government declared in 2007 that domestic tuition fees and other fees can be increased by a maximum of 2% per annum. To Management's knowledge, as a practice, every University in BC increase their fees by the maximum permissible. Management is not aware of any deviations from this practice.

**Discussion:** Management is recommending that domestic tuition fees and other fees be increased by 2% (the maximum allowable by the BC Government) for FY2017/18. There are no international tuition fee increases proposed for FY2017/18 at this time.

**Risks:** The proposed increase for domestic tuition and other fees will help to offset inflationary costs at the University. The increase does not even cover the full cost of inflation anticipated for FY2017/18. The risk to not increasing tuition fees is that AVED does not let Universities "catch" up if they decide in one year not to increase fees but need to "double-up" the increase in a subsequent period. If the institution decides to forgo its annual increase, that increase is lost in perpetuity. There is no competitive disadvantage to increasing tuition fees.

**Recommendation:** Management is recommending that domestic tuition fees and other fees increase by 2% for FY2017/18.

Re: International Student Tuition – Professional Cook Level 3 Apprenticeship

We seek your approval to charge an international tuition fee for a one-time basis for Professional Cook Level 3 Apprenticeship program as detailed below. This fee calculation is based on the Board Approved tuition fee rate of \$6,900 for up to 12 credits plus \$500 for each additional credit.

The Cook 3 program is quite different than academic programs and there is no easy way to compare equivalency therefore we decided to base it on the classroom hours to equate credits. We propose that the Professional Cook Level 3 Apprenticeship program adopt a fee model based on a 2-course equivalency (3 credits per course).

Program structure:

90 teaching hours equivalent to two courses

Tuition fee:

\$3,450 (6 credits)

Other fees:

 General fees (library, activity, etc.) \$319.74 (per M. Bluhm's Fee Memo of June 17, 2016)

Moving forward we will seek a Board of Governors approved fee in order to continue to promote this program to international students.
