

FIRST YEAR ECONOMICS COURSES

THERE ARE THREE FIRST YEAR ECONOMICS COURSES: ECON 122 (INTRODUCTION TO BASIC ECONOMICS), ECON 190 (PRINCIPLES OF MICROECONOMICS) AND ECON 195 (PRINCIPLES OF MACROECONOMICS). THERE ARE NO ECONOMICS PREREQUISITES FOR FIRST YEAR ECONOMICS COURSES; HOWEVER, PRINCIPLES OF ECONOMICS (ECON 190 AND ECON 195) BOTH HAVE MATHEMATICAL COMPETANCY REQUIREMENTS. TO TAKE EITHER PRINCIPLES COURSE, YOU MUST HAVE RECEIVED A B OR BETTER IN PRINCIPLES OF MATH 11 OR APPLICATIONS OF MATH 12, OR MATH 051, OR EQUIVALENT. AS WELL, PRINCIPLES OF MATH 12 IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED

IF YOUR MATHEMATICS IS NOT SUFFICIENT OR IF YOU DO NOT FEEL COMFORTABLE WITH YOUR MATHEMATICAL SKILLS, THE DEPARTMENT ENCOURAGES YOU TO TAKE ECON 122 FOR ACADEMIC CREDIT. **WARNING:** ACADEMIC CREDIT IS ONLY GIVEN FOR ECON 122 FOR STUDENTS WHO TAKE IT PRIOR TO PASSING EITHER ECON 190 OR ECON 195.
