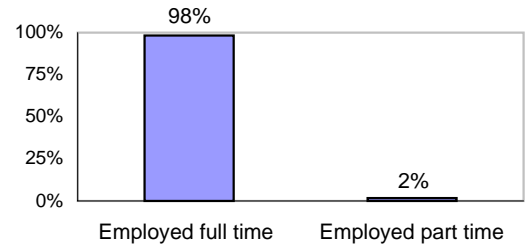

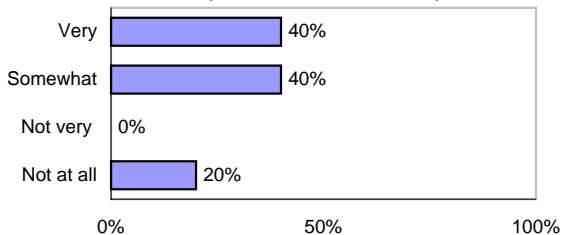
Of Employed Respondents Either Employed Full or Part Time: N=60

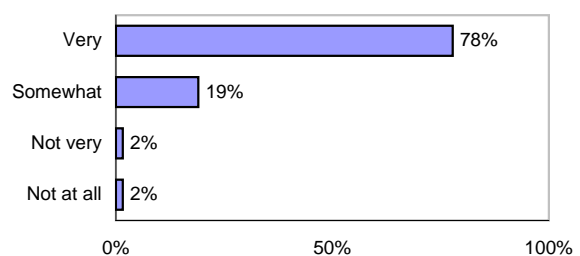
Usefulness of Studies

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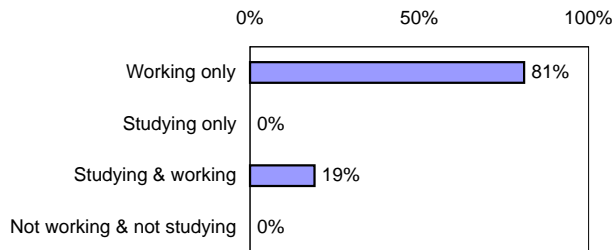

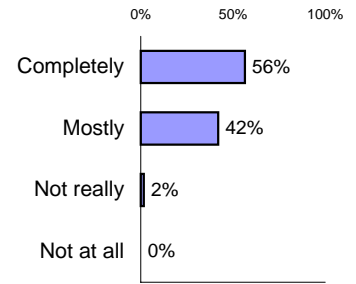

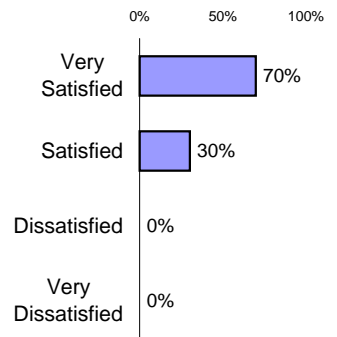
Overall Satisfaction

Was Main Reason for Enrolling Met?



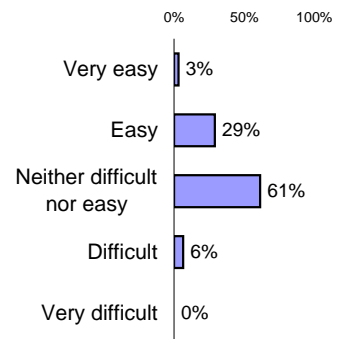

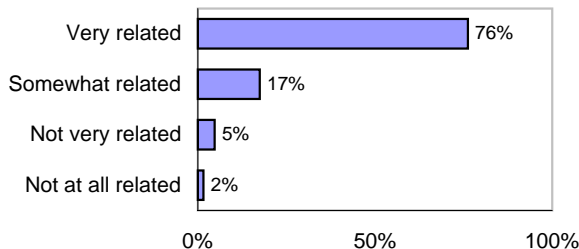

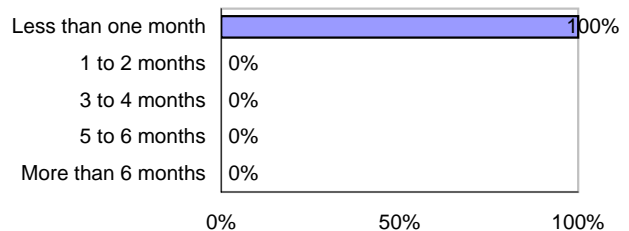
Of Those Currently Employed:
