### Program Description

The Faculty of Science at TRU offers a Bachelor of Natural Resource Science Degree (BNRS) on a full time or part time basis.

The BNRS Degree prepares students for careers in a wide range of natural resource sector jobs and for further academic study in graduate school. The program goals are met by providing a unique combination of courses covering biology, ecology, scientific methods, and sector-specific resource management skills in a cooperative education format. Students will learn problem solving, oral and written communication skills, and integration of various disciplines in both an independent and team environment.

The Program offers an honor's program, co-operative education opportunities and numerous courses needed for professional accreditation.

### Admission Requirements

#### Academic Requirements

- BC Grade 12, Mature student status (or equivalent)
- BC English 12/English 12 First Peoples with a minimum 73% (or equivalent)
- Biology 11, Chemistry 11, Pre-calculus Math 12 (or equivalents) all with at least a C+

**Note:** Students with Biology 12, Chemistry 12 (CHEM 0600) and Physics 12 (PHYS 0600) will be given preference

- Minimum entry cumulative GPA of 2.00

### How to Apply

**Submit your application** online through Education Planner BC website at or by using the paper application form found at [www.tru.ca/admissions/apply](http://www.tru.ca/admissions/apply)

#### 1. Pay the application fee:

- a. \$28.12 for Canadian citizens or permanent residents
- b. \$100.00 for International students (requires a Study Permit)

Your application is not processed until the application fee is received.

2. **Submit official high school transcripts.** For current high school students please submit final Grade 11 grades and an interim Grade 12 statement listing courses you are taking this year.

#### 3. Submit any post-secondary

#### transcripts. Next Steps

1. We will contact you within 2-3 weeks to confirm that we have received your application.
2. Use the check-list at the end of this sheet to ensure you have included all the supporting documents required for the program you are applying to. All documents must be submitted by in order for your application to be considered.
3. Once we have reviewed your application and applicable supporting documents, we will notify you about the admission decision
4. Admitted students will have to pay a commitment fee of \$300 to confirm their spot.
