3. **Grade 12 Student Information** - TRU will require a copy of your final high school transcript. Go to the Ministry of Education website to request that final high school transcripts be sent electronically to TRU. You will be able to access the Ministry website between January and June through their Post Secondary Institutions form (PSI).

5. **Register for courses.** Information will be sent to you in mid-June with your earliest date and time to register. The Fall and Winter Course Schedule shows when courses are offered and is online in early March. You are expected to create your own timetable. A **deposit** is due prior to registering for courses. On your date and time, use your myTRU to register for courses.
