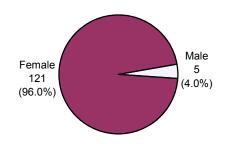

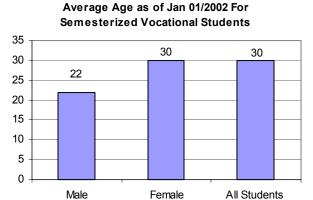

Total Summer 01 - Winter 02 Semesterized Vocational Gender Distribution

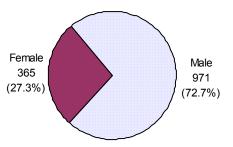


Total Summer 01 - Winter 02 Semesterized Vocational Age Distribution

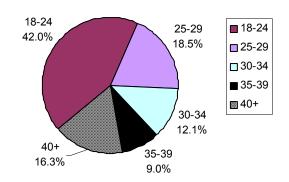




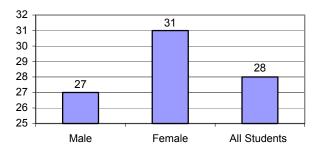
Total Summer 01 - Winter 02 Non-Semesterized Vocational Gender Distribution

Average Age as of Jan 01/2002 For Continuing Education Students Summer 01 - Winter 02



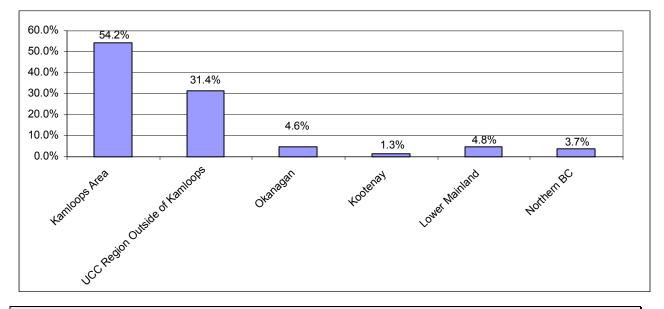

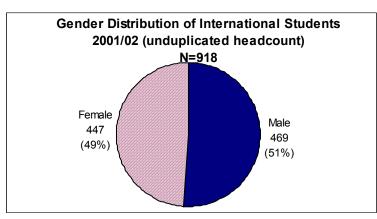
BC Regional Distribution of UCC Students

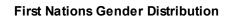

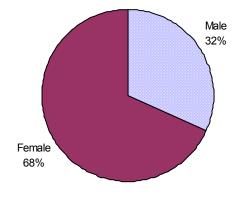

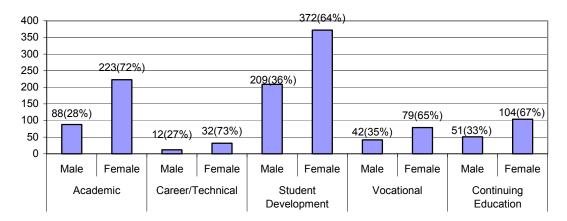

Distribution of First Nations Students by Gender and by Program Area**

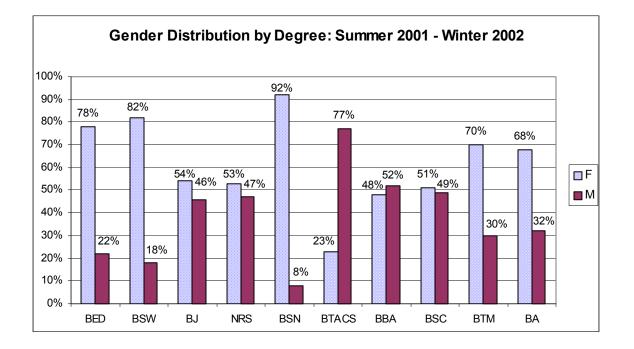

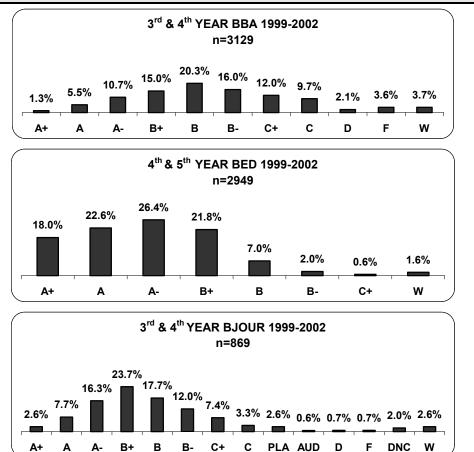


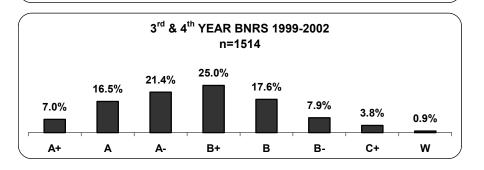


UCC DEGREE GRADE DISTRIBUTIONS: 1999-2002

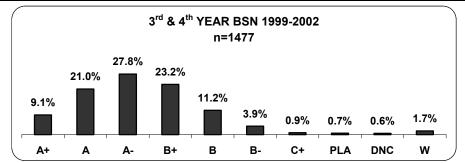


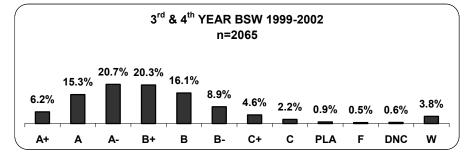
PROFESSIONAL DEGREES GRADE DISTRIBUTIONS – UPPER LEVEL– THREE YEAR ROLLUP

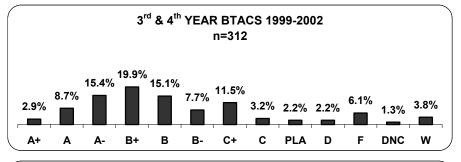


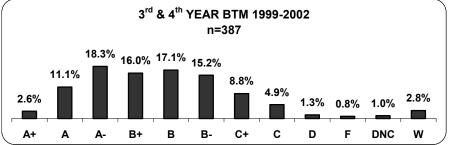


PROFESSIONAL DEGREES GRADE DISTRIBUTIONS – UPPER LEVEL– THREE YEAR ROLLUP



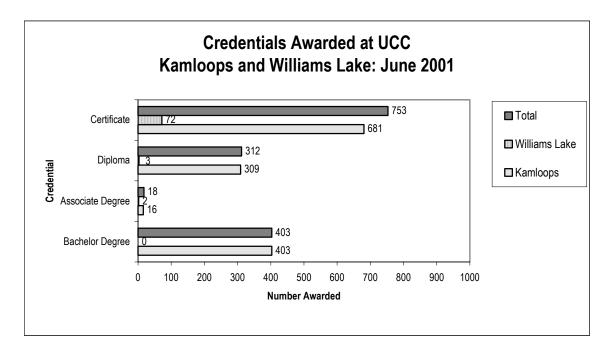


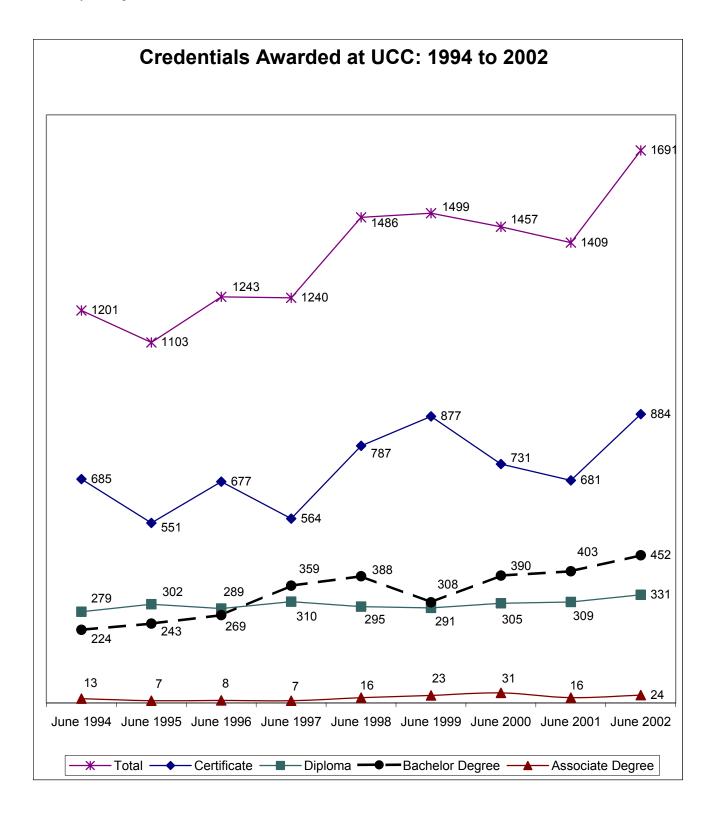




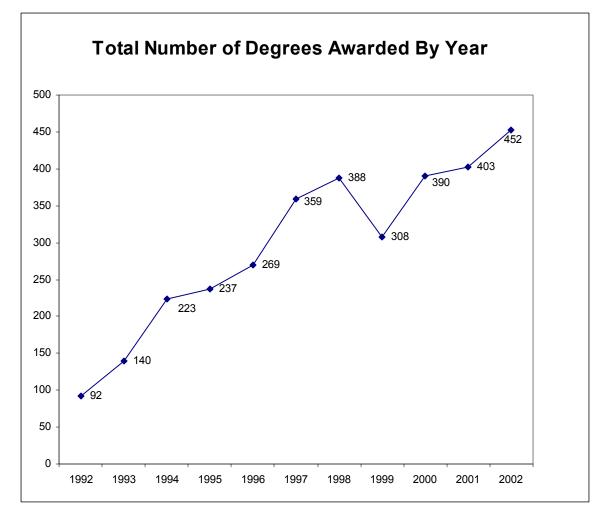
