Master of Occupational Therapy, MOT
University of British Columbia, Vancouver

The Master of Occupational Therapy degree, offered at The University of British Columbia, provides the professional education necessary to obtain a licence to practice Occupational therapy. The full time Master of Occupational Therapy curriculum spans two calendar years (24 months) beginning in late August.

The MOT program is offered on a competitive basis (48 seats for domestic applicants; 8 seats for international.). Prospective students must refer to the UBC website for a complete list of the educational and general admission requirements.

In addition to meeting the admission requirements of the Faculty of Graduate Studies at UBC, applicants must have the following:

1. Completion of a **recognized bachelor's degree** in any field and the successful completion of the following prerequisites:
 - **Human Anatomy (3 credits)** TRU OL's Kin 3259
 - **Social Sciences (3 credits)-** example: sociology, anthropology, human geography
 - **Behavioural Sciences (3 credits)-** example: psychology, learning & cognition, brain & behaviour

If uncertain if a prerequisite taken will meet the above requirement, a detailed course outline can be mailed to rehana.frankland@ubc.ca.

2. Academic standing of a **minimum B+ (76%) average** in senior level courses (3000 and 4000 level).
3. **70 volunteer hours** or work experience with people with disabilities.
A minimum of 70 hours of volunteer or paid work which includes direct contact involving interacting with persons with cognitive, emotional or physical disabilities at no more than two facilities.
4. **Three reference letters** – refer to website for details regarding types of references required and copies of forms → www.grad.ubc.ca/forms/
5. **English Competency**- refer to website for details.
6. **Official Transcripts**- two copies per institution- refer to website on criteria required for acceptance.
7. **Interview** – applicants who meet the above minimum requirements are eligible for interview consideration (verbal communication skill, maturity and personal suitability). The interview will comprise of a verbal interview. Fulfilment of the minimum requirements, however, does not guarantee an interview. Selection of interview candidates is based on the academic standing in the senior level courses.
8. Application deadline date: **February 1**
