Program Description

Designed for the working professional involved in education, training or employee development, the Master of Education program is structured for full or part-time study.

The program offers:

- Courses with a variety of focus areas to choose from: Educational Leadership, Inclusive and Special Education, Curriculum, and Counseling
- Three completion options: thesis, final project or capstone course

Experiential learning is at the heart of this program; you will actively participate in classroom discussions and readings, analyze information, utilize data in a professional setting, and then explore various methods to reflect their impact.

Through independent study, web-based research and guided inquiry, you will strengthen and enhance your understanding of educational issues while raising your own professional profile.

Admission Requirements

- Four-year undergraduate degree from an accredited institution with a minimum GPA of 3.0 on a scale of 4.33 in the most recent 60 credits taken or success completion of the TRU Graduate Certificate in Educational Studies with a minimum GPA of B
- English language proficiency of IELTS 6.5 with no bands below 6.5 or equivalent

How to Apply

1. **Submit your application** online at <https://apply.educationplannerbc.ca/tru.jsp>
2. **Pay the application fee:**
 - \$100.00 for International Students
 - \$28.15 for Canadian citizens or Permanent Residents
3. **Submit the following required documentation:**
 - A personal resume
 - A letter of intent (350 words max.) which addresses the applicants motivation for undertaking the M.Ed. program and the applicants expectations of the program in terms of career and personal education goals.
 - Two letters of reference which address the applicant's suitability for a rigorous academic program and ability to work effectively with colleagues. Reference letters can also include other comments that may assist the selection committee in making informed decisions.
 - Proof of English language proficiency if undergraduate degree was awarded in a country that does not consider English to be its first official language. (Instruction in English is not sufficient for waiving the language requirement)
 - Proof of undergraduate degree awarded *if the credential is not indicated on official transcripts*
 - Copy of official academic transcripts for all post-secondary education in both English and original language (secondary school transcripts are not required)

NOTE: We accept scanned copies of official transcripts for application purposes only. However, if you have official transcripts that are still sealed in envelopes from the issuing institution and have never been opened, we recommend you consider sending these to us via courier.

All required documentation must be received by the Graduate Admissions Office in order for your application to be considered complete and ready for processing.

Next Steps:

Once all required supporting documentation has been received by the Graduate Admissions Office, your application will be processed and sent to the program selection committee for a decision regarding admission to the program. When a decision has been provided by the committee, you will be contacted by email. The application process takes between two and six weeks.
