The Cook Workplace Apprenticeship program is piloting a flexible delivery method in partnership with Earls Kitchen and Bar, enabling students to work toward their Apprenticeship Level I certification while remaining employed in Kamloops.

Funding Supports Training for Aboriginal Learners

TRU and community partners Alexis Creek First Nation and Northern Shuswap Tribal Council will receive BC Ministry of Advanced Education funding to deliver training programs to 27 Aboriginal learners.

Finance Programs Acknowledged by CFA Institute

TRU's Bachelor of Business Administration finance major and Post-Baccalaureate Diploma in Finance have been acknowledged by the CFA Institute as preparing students well to become chartered financial analysts (CFAs).

Mining and Minerals Diploma
