**Guideline for Physical Education  
students transferring to the  
University of Victoria's  
Bachelor of Education (Secondary  
Curriculum)**

Students may complete the first year prerequisite courses at TRU to transfer to the University of Victoria's Bachelor of Education (Secondary Curriculum) program with a physical education teaching area. Entry into this program is restricted by quota. Initial admission to the program, with a physical education teaching area, may be granted only after completion of at least one year of university level studies acceptable to the School of Exercise Science, Physical and Health Education and the Faculty of Education.

Students who wish to transfer to UVic must apply by **January 31**. Application packages and information on application procedures are available from UVic Undergraduate Admissions after the 1<sup>st</sup> of November. Application for Admission can be found at:

The University of Victoria has provided the following information for prospective education students who would like to teach physical education in a high school.

1. **Admission to UVic's Bachelor of Education (Secondary Curriculum) Program with a physical education teaching area requires:**
  - a) admissibility to the University of Victoria
  - b) at least 12 units (or 24 credits) that include:
    - 3.0 units (or 6.0 credits) of approved English (TRU's Engl 1100 + 1 of: Engl 1110, 1120, 1140)
    - the equivalent of UVic's EPHE 141. (TRU's Biol 1590/1690)
    - the equivalent of UVic's EPHE 143.(TRU's Phed 2110)
  - c) a grade-point average of at least 3.0 (using a 9-point scale) on the most recent session and, if that session is less than 12 units (or 24 credits), a grade-point average of at least 3.0 (UVic C+) on the most recent 12 units or 24 credits.
  - d) A successful interview with the School of Exercise Science, Physical and Health Education.
  - e) All requirements for admission must be completed by **April 30** and must be documented by **May 31**, except where otherwise specified.

## 2. Interview

The Faculty of Education is committed to interviewing suitable applicants to the teacher education programs. You should demonstrate good communication skills, consideration of your career goals and some understanding of the benefits gained through physical education and recreation/leisure programs. For information about interviews, applicants should contact the School of Exercise Science, Physical and Health Education.

## 3. Grade Point Average (GPA)

Your grade point average (GPA) is an important part of the selection procedures. It is based on your most recently completed session of university or college courses and must consist of a minimum of 12 units (or 24 credits). If you are currently registered in 12 or more units of university course work (in 24 or more credits), the grade point average you achieve upon completion of these courses will be used for selection.

If you are currently registered in **less than 12** units (or 24 credits), the GPA will be determined by using a combination of the GPA you achieve upon completion of the current courses and the GPA from your previous session for the number of units required to reach the 12 unit or 24 credit minimum.

Example calculation:	Current Session GPA:	4.5 x 9.5 registered units = 42.75
	Previous Session GPA:	4.0 x <u>2.5</u> registered units = <u>10.00</u>
		12.0 units                      52.75
	Selection GPA:	52.75 divided by 12 units = 4.39

## 4. How Decisions Will Be Made

Your weighted scores for the different sections are summated and placed in rank order with other applicants. Cut off points for acceptance are determined each year based on the quota of students admitted to the programs. The weighting for the different sections is as follows:

70%	GPA
<u>30%</u>	Interview
<b>100%</b>	<b>Total Score</b>

## 5. Notification of Results

New UVic students will be notified by Undergraduate Admissions of the outcome of their application no later than **June 30** provided all supporting information has been received. Undergraduate Admissions will send admission letters to new UVic students indicating the program to which they have been accepted.

**\*NOTE: Students who complete ENGL 1100 with less than a B- grade, or any two of ENGL 1110, 1120, 1140 or 1210 with less than a B- average, will be required to take additional English to satisfy the written English competency requirement.**

1. Students should select at least 2 - 4 courses towards a second teaching concentration as approved by UVic – see UVic calendar. Most students will take 3 units of elective (not education) in their program. These may be taken in first year. Students who have selected English as a teaching concentration must take at least 2 electives (not from physical education) in first year. Neither German nor Theatre/Drama in Education may be taken in combination with Physical Education. It is suggested that advice be obtained from the UVic Education Advising Centre to ensure that courses taken will carry credit to the appropriate program.
2. 1 credit TRU activities transfer as 0.5 units to UVic. Required activities are Swimming, Track and Field, Gymnastics, Basketball, Volleyball, Dance, Badminton or Tennis, Soccer or Rugby.
3. Students who do not possess a valid Bronze Medallion Certificate should take PHED 1140 – Aquatics at TRU.
4. It is strongly recommended that a student not attempt to take 21 credits in one term.

**Note: The following information is intended as a guideline for physical education students planning on transferring to UVic. Due to changes that occur at all institutions it is the responsibility of the student to ensure that the courses selected meet the requirements of the institution they are graduating from.**
