#### **Aboriginal Services Coordinator**

TRU offers Indigenous students (Status, Non-status, Metis and Inuit) support services designed to enhance your experience at TRU culturally, socially and academically and assist you in achieving success as students. Visit the Gathering Place or call 250-392-8179.

#### **Academic Advisor**

The academic advisor provides individuals with current information about courses and programs. #### **Continuing Studies**

#### Counsellor

The counsellor deals with personal issues that may affect a student's academic performance and/or well-being. Visits are voluntary and confidential (within the limits of the law) and designed to help students work out their own solutions to academic, vocational, social or personal problems. The major focus is on career counselling and short term or crisis intervention. Appointments are booked in advance but emergency or crisis situations are dealt with as quickly as possible. #### **Gathering Place**

The Gathering Place provides a safe, supportive environment and culturally appropriate services to all students, including TRU Open Learning students. It is staffed by a full-time Open Learning facilitator and an Aboriginal services coordinator. It is open Monday to Friday from 8.30 a.m.-4.30 p.m., with some tutoring appointments available at other times. Stop by or call 250-392-8179.

#### **Health Centre**

The Williams Lake & District Credit Union Community Health Centre is open to students, faculty, staff and community members. In addition, it offers appointments for urgent conditions for those who cannot get in to see their doctor quickly, as well as sexual health services such as STI testing and treatment, contraception counselling and prescribing, IUD insertion, pregnancy testing and counselling. #### Library

The library offers research and learning support to all students. ## **Campus Card**

This photo identification card is required to access library services, to access the Cariboo Memorial Complex at no cost, and as identification on campus. The Campus Card also provides various student discounts at merchants throughout the City of Williams Lake.

When your Campus Card is ready it can be picked up at the Library Centre. You will need to show one piece of photo ID in order to receive your card.

#### Prepare your photo:

Your photo must be in jpg format

- 1. Your photo should be taken against a plain (preferably white) background
- 2. The photo should be a headshot with a clear view of the face (no hats, sunglasses, or silly faces)
- 3. You can smile!
- 4. The file that you send should be no larger than 1.2 MB
- 5. Use your TID (student ID number) as the file name

#### Send us your photo:

Log into your myTRU account and open up your email. Your photo must be sent from your myTRU account

- 1. Create an email to send to wlselfie@tru.ca
- 2. Write your full name and TRU ID number in the Subject line of the email
- 3. Attach your jpg file
- 4. Hit send
- 5. Check for a confirmation email from us. This email will include a Cardholder Agreement and instructions on when and where to pick up your new Campus Card. Be sure to read it so that you understand how your card may be used. You will sign this agreement when you pick up your card.
- 6. If we have any problems using your photo, we will email you within a week. Please check back into your email to ensure everything is fine.

# **Campus Information**

#### **Block Scheduling**

TRU Williams Lake has three semesters. The Fall and Winter semesters are divided into two six-week compressed "blocks." Trades programs and some UEPREP and vocational programs do not follow the blocked schedule. Add/drop and withdraw dates will vary. Please visit the Admissions Office within the first week of classes if you are considering changing your schedule.

#### **Fall Semester**

The Fall Semester is scheduled from September to December. This year the "blocks" are as follows:

Fall I: September 10, 2018 - October 26, 2018

Fall II: October 29, 2018 - December 15, 2018

#### Winter Semester

The Winter semester is scheduled from January to April. This year the "blocks" are as follows:

Winter I: January 7, 2019 - March 1, 2019

Winter II: March 4, 2019- April 26, 2019

#### **Summer Session**

Some courses and programs run during the summer session that runs from May to August. Please check with the Academic Advisor or your program coordinator to see if your program requires summer courses.

#### Lockers

Lockers are available for rent for \$10 per semester. You can sign up for your locker at the Reception desk. You must provide your own lock. Cash or cheque only.

#### Parking

Parking fees are allocated to the ongoing maintenance and development of the grounds and parking lots. In addition, they cover the costs of snow removal and sanding in the winter months. The following rates apply for parking on the Williams Lake Campus.

#### Rates:

- \$150/semester (September December)
- \$75/semester for motorcycles
- \$3/day
- \$1.50/day for motorcycles
- \$2/half day
- \$1/hour

Drivers can register for a parking pass from the Library Centre or purchase individual daily tickets. No parking spaces will be reserved. If you wish to purchase a semester pass, please complete the Pay Parking Agreement, before bringing it to the Library Centre for payment. After you have paid, please bring the completed agreement along with the receipt of payment to Campus Reception to receive your parking pass. Parking rates are in effect from September to April starting at 8:00am until 5:00pm, Monday to Friday with the exception of weekends, statutory holidays and days when TRU is officially closed. Parking fees will take effect Monday, September 10, 2018.
