

- Reporting: It is mandatory that all licensee's complete a Gaming Event Revenue Report within 90 days after an event has occurred and the license period expires. - Gaming Event Revenue Reports submitted by mail, fax or email are no longer accepted.
- Please be advised, **completed applications** for a Class A licence **must be received** by the Gaming Policy and Enforcement Branch's Licensing Division **at a minimum of 10 weeks prior to the event start date**. Completed applications are considered to include all required documentation at the time of submission. Should the minimum 10-week processing period not be met in the future, you may be at risk for not receiving your application by the desired date.
- Please be advised if/when doing virtual draws ticket purchasers must have pertinent information for the draw so they are able to observer the live draw.
- In addition to having a witness what we are doing during these times of COVID-19 we are requiring your organization to live-stream/post the draws and winning ticket through social media and have a witness for the virtual draw.
