PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

Our open programs are an exciting opportunity to explore BC, meet people from around the world and work on your language skills. No matter your language level or area of interest, there is something for you at TRU.

Winter Language and Culture program

February 13 – March 3, 2023 | \$3,075

This program has all the components of our summer open programs, but with a winter spin. Embrace a true Canadian experience by visiting Kamloops in the winter and participate in traditional winter activities such as skiing, curling, sleigh rides and snowshoeing. In between spending your time outdoors, you will participate in language classes and study different cultural theories and strategies for communicating.

Online Language and Culture programs February 13 – March 3, 2023 | \$1,395 July 11 – 29, 2023 | \$1,395 August 8 – 26, 2023 | \$1,395

A great option for students interested in meeting new people and improving their intercultural communication skills but cannot travel. The Online Language and Culture program allows you to immerse yourself virtually in elements of Canadian culture, explore aspects of intercultural communication, participate in an elective and experience an individualized learning experience through one-to-one sessions with your instructor.

Language and Culture Soccer Camp June 26 – July 14, 2023 | \$3,155

Take your soccer skills to the next level and meet other players from around the world. Participate in soccer skills training, language studies, strength training and cultural activities. Learn from TRU's varsity soccer team, the WolfPack, and improve your knowledge of health and nutrition from industry experts. You will have the chance to participate in a tournament at the end of the program.




McGill Residence (On Campus)


This community is ideal for students looking for an active, close-knit, communal experience. The newly renovated McGill Residence has amenities that include laundry, games room, kitchen and study room.


McGill Residence Floor Plan: 4-bedroom quad
