The Indigenous Mentor Program assists new students with a successful transition into Thompson Rivers University.

Through training, the TRU Mentor Program develops mentors' skills and abilities for the work they do independently and collaboratively for the Students they mentor. Mentoring happens in different forms (One-to-one, groups, events, workshops, etc.) and based on student needs. The program is supported by the Indigenous Mentor Coordinator in Cplul'kw'ten ("The Gathering Place") in House 5.



Purpose: To provide on going support and mentoring to new Indigenous Students attending Thompson Rivers University (Kamloops).

Eligibility: Must be at least 18 years of age and a self-identified Indigenous Student attending part-time or full-time in the Fall and Winter semesters at TRU Kamloops with one year Post-Secondary experience.

Commitment: Minimum of 4 hours per week September—April, Attend trainings, scheduled meetings, and commit to Orientation Week in September.

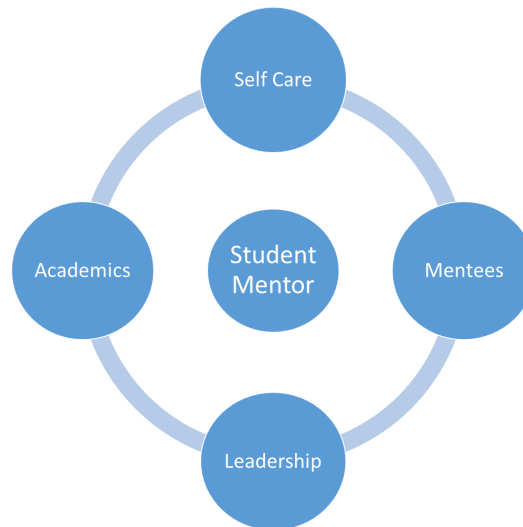


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What do Mentors Do?

- ⇒ Attend training sessions and other opportunities for leadership development
- ⇒ Maintain positive relationships with Mentees and other students as ambassadors of TRU
- ⇒ Support other programs and initiatives through dissemination of information
- ⇒ Offer academic support to students
- ⇒ Assist and offer guidance during orientation and as needed throughout semester
- ⇒ Commit to a Mentor Project
