




Student Responsibilities:

- Students are strongly encouraged to speak confidentially with their instructors about their accommodations.
- If a course has any secondary instructors and/or practicum coordinators, students are encouraged
 to share a copy of their accommodation letter.
- Students must inform their AS Advisor if they add or drop a course or if they have any instructor changes.

- Students approved for ongoing accommodations must contact AS every semester to request that
 their accommodation letter(s) are sent out. If students would like to make any changes to their
 accommodations, they must connect with their advisor.
- Students with exam accommodations must book their exam(s) with our office before the <u>exam</u> <u>deadline</u> to ensure that they have access to their accommodations.
 - Courses being delivered in an online/alternate format:
 - For students taking classes in an online/alternate delivery format (excluding Open Learning courses) this semester, we ask that you book your exams with us online in order to officially request your exam accommodations through Accessibility Services. Please book your exams prior to the <u>booking deadlines</u> and indicate on the <u>online booking form</u> that your course is being offered "online". Once we have the exam details, Accommodations Coordinators will be able to connect with you and your instructor(s) to ensure accommodations are implemented accurately in an online or alternate format.
 - Students are responsible for creating an exam environment conducive to their accommodation needs (e.g., distraction-reduced environment, appropriate ergonomics, approved assistive technology, etc.).
 - o Courses being delivered on the Kamloops campus:
 - The AS Test Centre is only available to facilitate exams for students who are taking TRU courses that are being offered in-person on the Kamloops campus. Please book your exams prior to the <u>booking deadlines</u> and indicate on the <u>online booking form</u> that your course is being offered "in-person". After booking you will receive an email with instructions and details about the COVID-19 protocols required to write in the AS Test Centre.

Instructor Responsibilities:

- · Instructors are encouraged to speak confidentially with students about their accommodations.
- Instructors are responsible for following exam delivery requirements:
 - o For courses being delivered in an online/alternate format:
 - Please ensure that approved accommodations related to exam scheduling or duration are implemented.
 - Please ensure that exams are delivered in an accessible format for students requiring assistive technology.
 - o For courses being delivered on the Kamloops campus:
 - Please email your exam to <u>asexams@tru.ca</u> at least 24 hours (equivalent to one full business day) prior to the scheduled exam date.
- If instructors have any questions or concerns about accommodations regarding the demonstration of essential course requirements, they must discuss with the student and/or contact an Accessibility Services Advisor as soon as possible.
