### **Education Within Reach**

#### What Does Accessibility Services (A.S.) Do?

- Provides academic accommodations and services to all eligible TRU students with diagnosed disabilities.
- Facilitates equal access to educational opportunities by reducing physical, attitudinal, and systemic barriers.
- Accommodations include: exam accommodations, alternative format text materials, sign language interpretation, access to assistive technology, notetaking facilitation, and more.

#### **Eligibility to Access Services**

- Students must have documentation of a diagnosed disability.
- Disabilities can range from physical to invisible. Some examples of verifiable disabilities include (but are not limited to):
  - chronic/systemic health impairments
  - visual impairments
  - hearing impairments
  - mobility/functional impairments
  - neurological disabilities
  - mental health disabilities
  - learning disabilities

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## **STEPS TO ACCESS SERVICES**

#### **Step 1: Meet with an Accessibility Advisor.**

When: Three months before the start of the semester. Make an appointment with an A.S. Advisor to discuss your needs and which services you are eligible for.

#### **Step 2: Get Necessary Documentation.**

When: One month before the start of a semester.

After the initial appointment, acquire the documentation necessary for accessing the accommodations and/or funding that you discussed with your advisor.

### Step 3: Send out accommodation letter(s).

When: First week of classes.

Contact the A.S office at the start of the semester to have your accommodation letters distributed.



#### Step 4: Follow Up.

**When: Second Week of Classes** 

Follow up with your instructors after they receive your accommodation letters. Meet with your Accommodations Coordinator to discuss your accommodations and book your exams.

#### Step 5: Access Accommodations.

When: Throughout the semester.

Make use of the accommodations for which you have been approved. Connect with the A.S Learning Strategist and/or Assistive Technology Specialist.

#### **Step 6: Continue Accessing.**

**When: Start of Every Semester.** 

If you would like to continue accessing accommodations, contact the A.S. office each semester to request that they send out your accommodation letters and continue the process.
