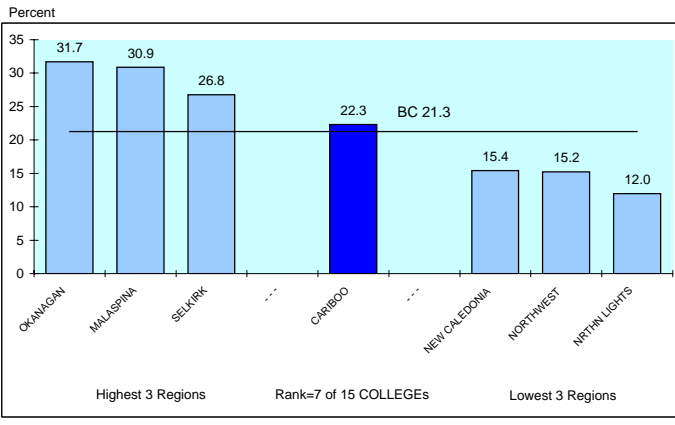

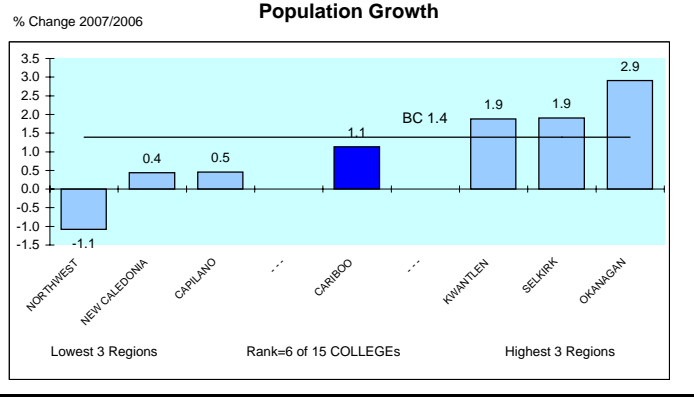

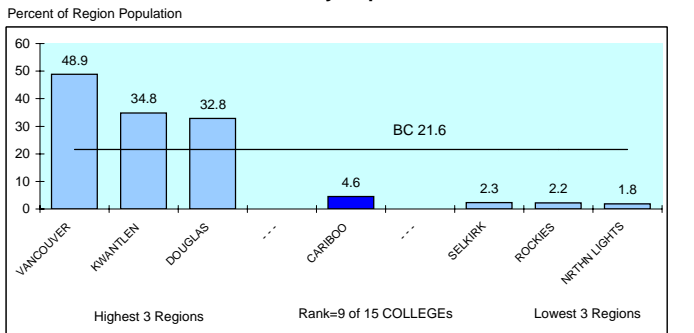

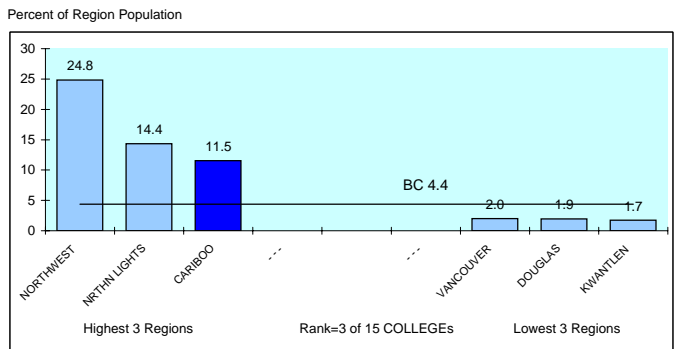

Visible Minority Population - 2001



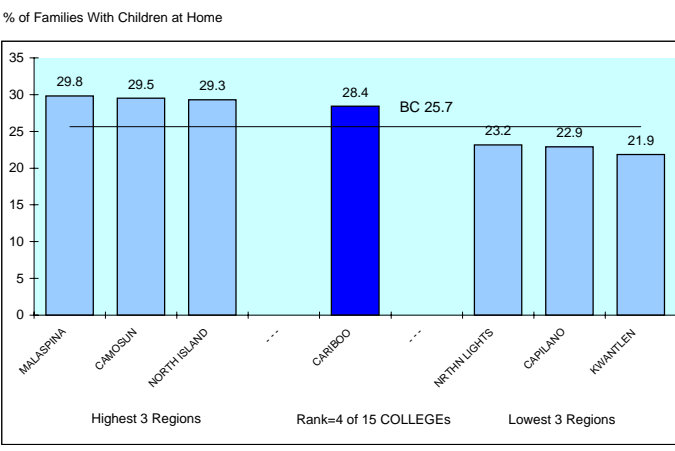
Aboriginal Identity - 2001

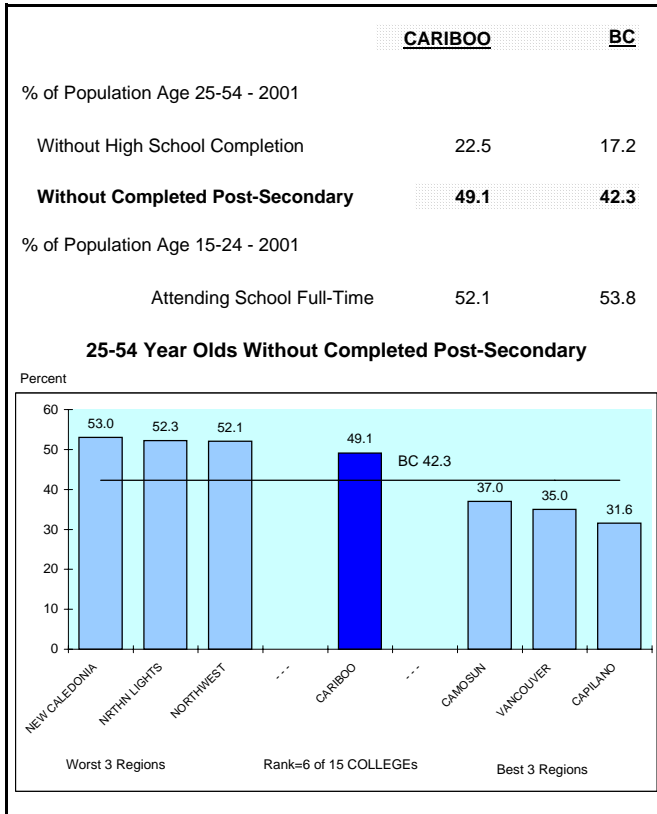

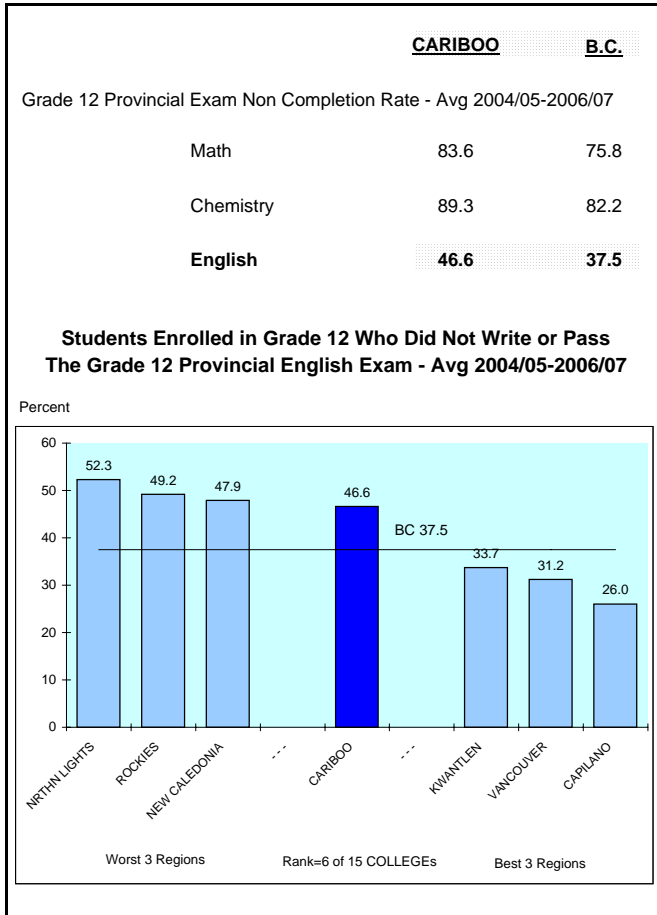

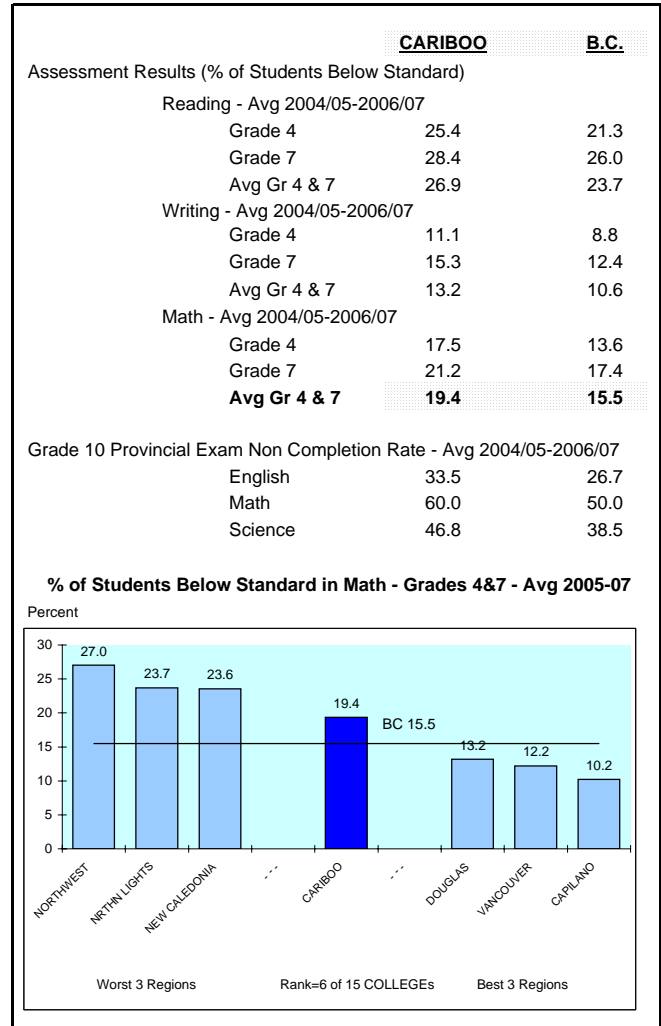

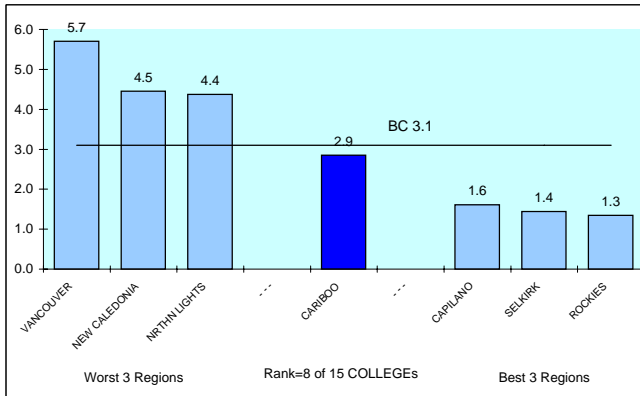

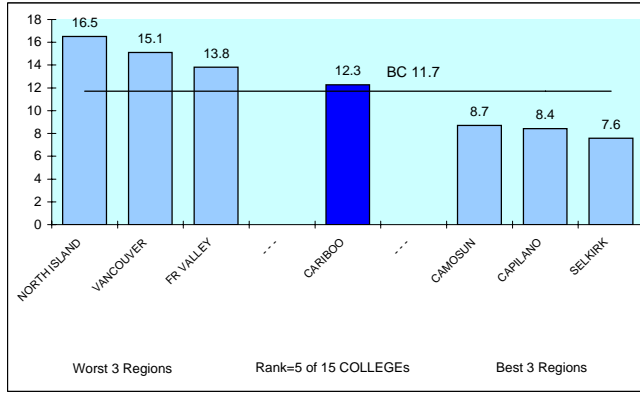
Serious Violent Crime Rate - 2004-2006

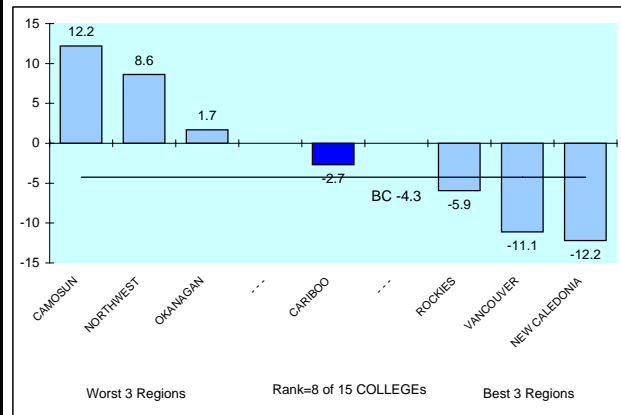

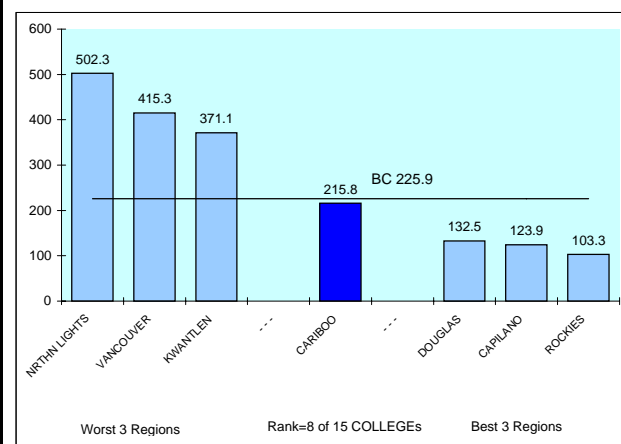

Non-Cannabis Drug Offences - Avg 2004-2006

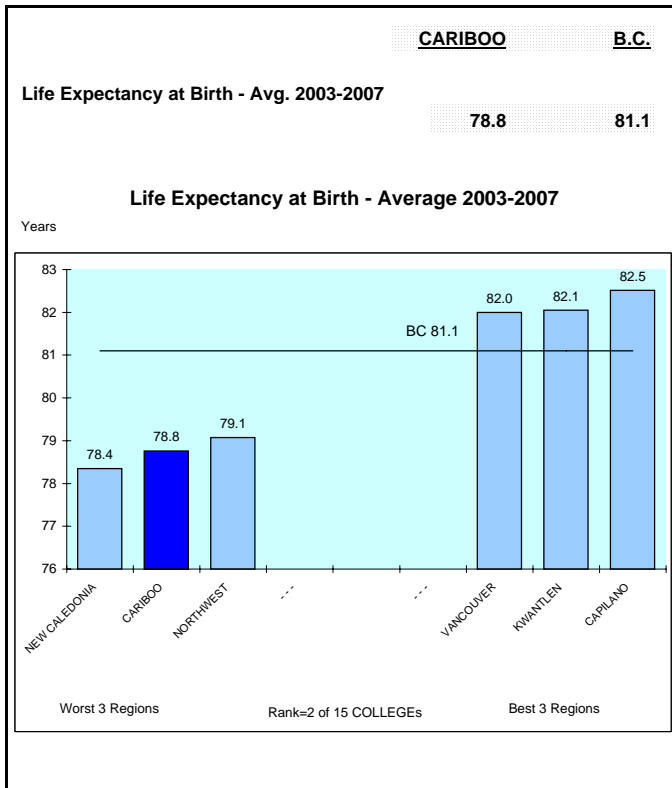

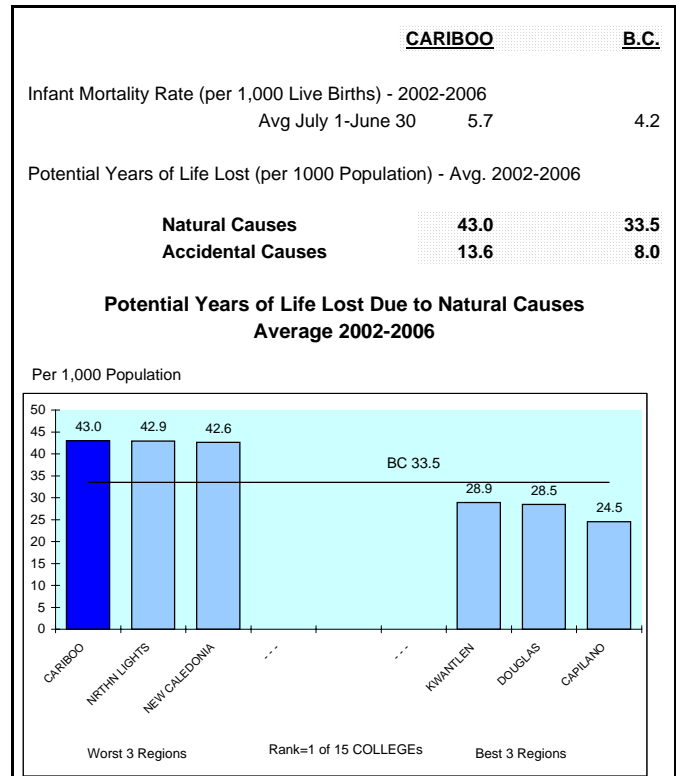

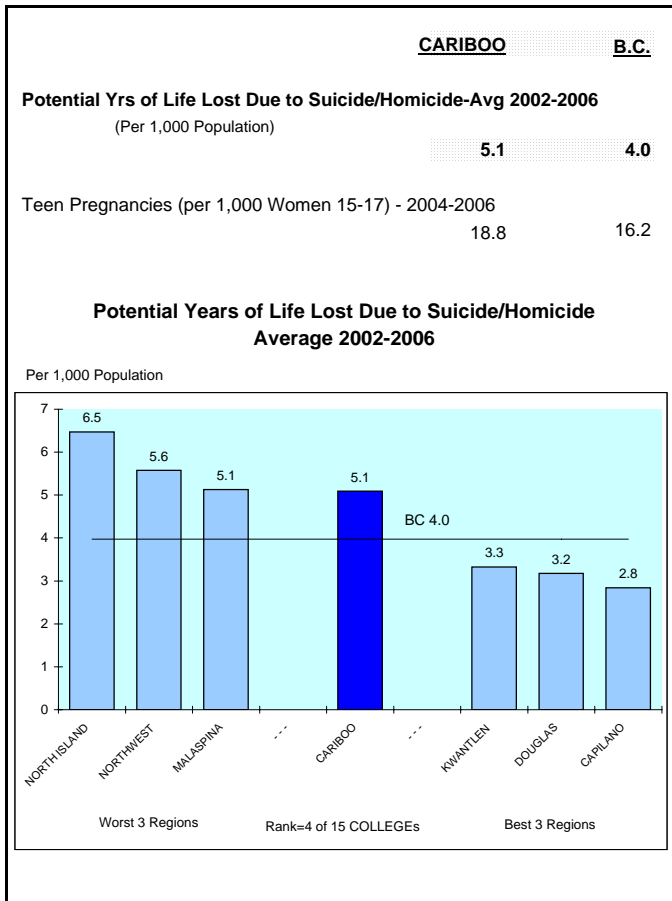

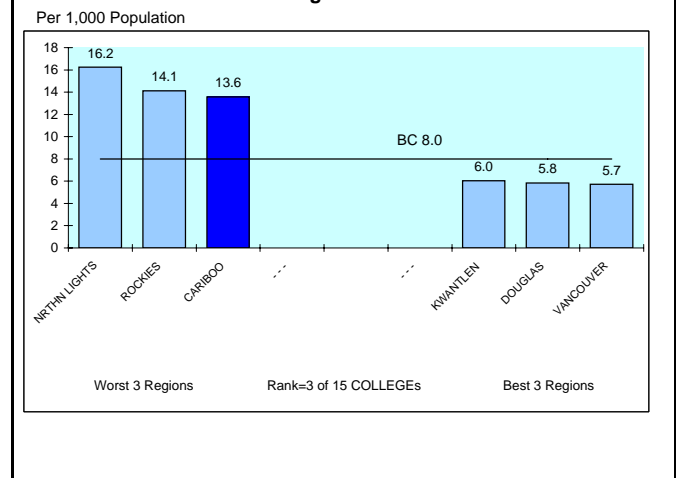

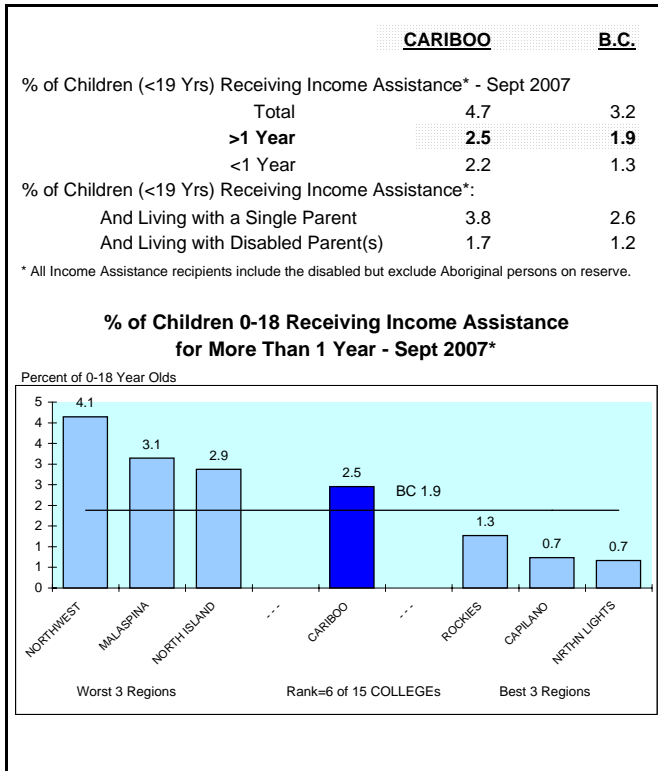

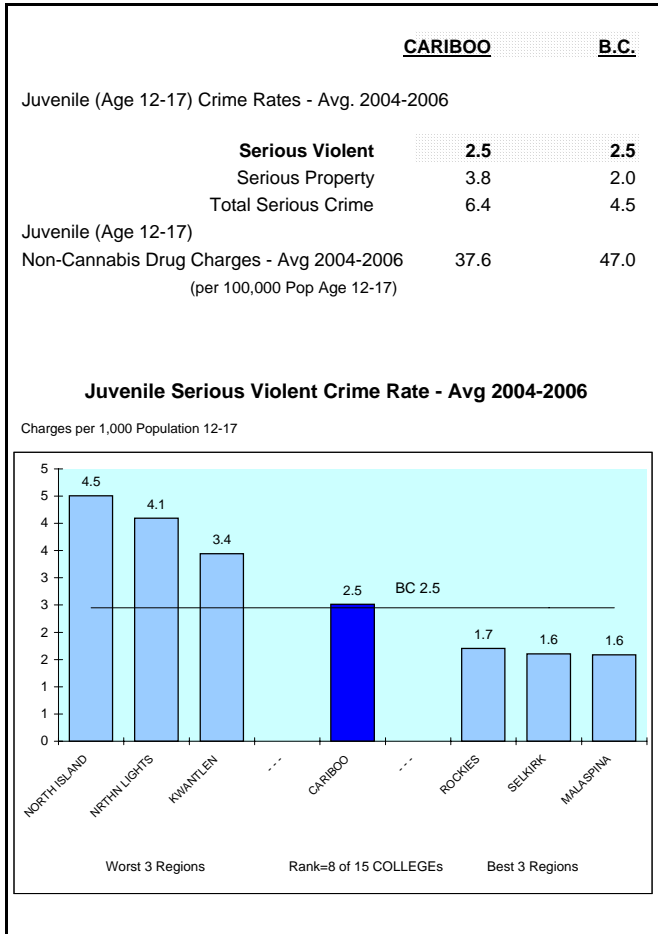

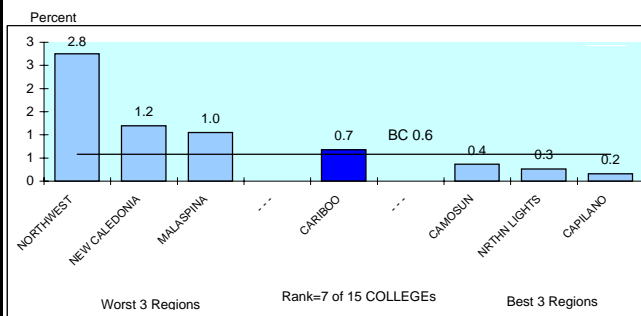

% of Youth 19-24 Receiving Income Assistance Who Are Employable

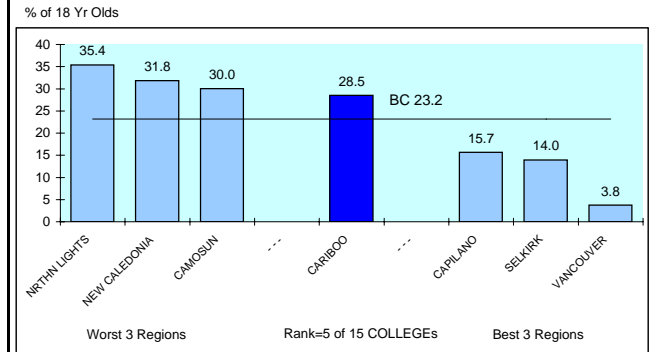

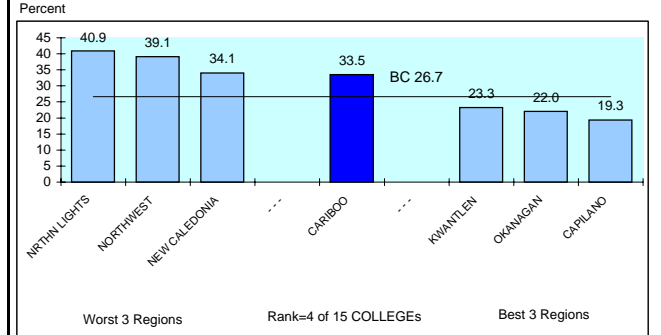

18 Year Olds Who Did Not Graduate Avg 2004/05-2006/07



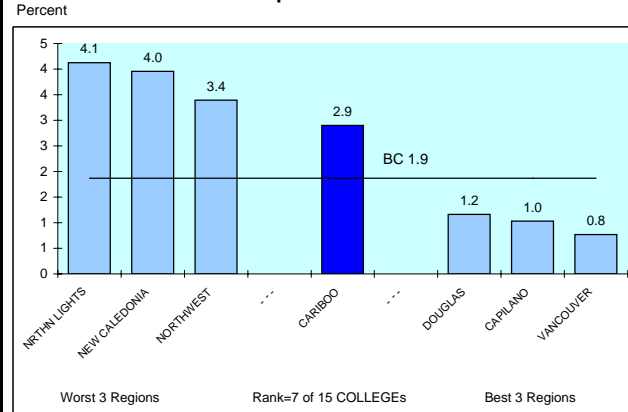
Gr. 10 Prov. Exam Non-Completion Rate - English - Avg 2004/05-2006/07
