Who:


- First, middle, graduating Baccalaureate students
 - 44 Canadian institutions, 15,000+ students in winter 2022

What:

 Undergraduate student satisfaction and experience

When:

- Administered in winter 2022 to first-year students
- 37% overall response rate (369 responses)
 - 31% Canadian average



 - 61% Canada




Top 5 reasons for going to university



88% of TRU first-year students were satisfied with the quality of teaching they received (83% Canadian)

Top Five Most Positive Experiences with Professors

Professors...

- 1. Treated students the same regardless of gender (96%)
- 2. Seemed knowledgeable in their fields (96%)
- 3. Treated students the same regardless of race (95%)
- 4. Were reasonably accessible outside of class (93%)
- 5. Were well organized in teaching (88%)

Least Positive Experience with Professors

Professors...

1. Took a personal interest in academic progress (62%)



89% reported that Teaching Assistants were helpful






% agree or strongly agree




Commitment to Completion










Career Plans

Overall Evaluation

	TRU	Canada
The decision to attend the university	91% satisfied or very satisfied	89%
The quality of teaching	88% agree or strongly agree	83%
The concern shown for individual	76% satisfied or very satisfied	66%
Feel like I belong at this university	76% some or very much	74%
Meet or exceeded expectations	85% meet or exceeded	81%
Recommend this university	71% 7 to 10, out of 10	75%
