Research Continuity Planning

In an effort to minimize the risk of contracting or spreading COVID-19 in human participant research interactions, and to preserve personal protective equipment for clinical care, the University is advising restrictions on human subjects research effective Friday, March 20 and continuing through May 1. We will continue to re-evaluate this timeframe.

In addition, all Principal Investigators and Faculty Supervisors should evaluate each active research project they are leading/supervising and develop project-specific plans for continuity of the research.
