## Why choose the Education Assistant and Community Support Certificate at TRU?

When you choose to enroll in the Education Assistant and Community Support (EACS) certificate, you are embarking on an 8-month journey to employment readiness. The EACS Certificate program will prepare you for careers with schools and agencies that provide support and service to children, youth, or adults with exceptionalities. Graduates of the program are able to assist individuals with special needs to learn educational, social, vocational, recreational and personal life skills.

During the Winter semester, you will be able to gain on-the-job training during your field work practicum, with placements offered in schools and community agencies. Where will an EACS Certificate take me?

Upon graduation, several career options will await you, including:

Certified Education Assistant (CEA) Community Support Worker (CSW)

This certification is required to work for SD#73 as a CEA and as a CSW in the community.

Over 90% of graduates from the TRU EACS Certificate find work related to the field within four months of program completion. You will also have the option to ladder directly into Year Two of the Human Service Diploma program.
