Report by Maria Buff, new Director of Capital Projects.

### **New Build Projects - Current**

1. East Village Student Housing, estimate completion September, 2023. 148 new student beds in a modular build. There will be a 40 bike enclosure and 2 EV chargers. This whole site will be fully electric.

City is requiring a multi-use path connecting Dalgleish to Summit. More multi-use paths will be developed.

Conversation with the City regarding an overpass. COK has requested a grant from the Federal Government. Have not heard back from the Federal level.

**2.** Research and Emergency Services Modular Building, estimate completion June, 2023. On site of the new Early Child Education Building.

Looking at Certificate in Leadership in Environmental Sustainability. Get points for taking sustainability courses and taking parts in activities on campus. Trying to advertise and raise the visibility of the Certificate.

Chantal Sullivan and Umme Mansoory will be creating video content to advertise the Certificate. Working with MarCom.

Brad H. and Crystal H. will coordinate with the advertising of the Certificate.

Within Crystal's department, they offer a course Sustainability in Action – project course. Half theory and half project. Special topics geography/environment studies course. This would be a trial course.

Received funding from BC Hydro for electric vehicle conversation project. Will convert a gas-powered facilities van to electric.

Solar Table Design Competition 2.0. For students to design a solar table deadline February 21, 2023.

Community Climate Action Plan Art Competition on campus. Hoping to launch this semester. Promote the 8 Big Moves of the City of Kamloops through Art around campus.

Seat Heater Defeater Project. If you currently have a space heater, you can turn it in and we will give you a chair heater.

Transition Kamloops – more on a personal level – tied into a course what you can do about climate change. James will send out the link.

Need to put a plan together for more people to help with the STARS report for three years.

E-bikes parking pass. Can this parking pass be expanded – longer ie: November 1 – April 1. Yes, this can be expanded.
