Participate in an intake interview

When should you apply?

The ESTR program has limited enrollment. Submit your completed application package to the TRU Admissions Office (OM1155) early to be considered for the next academic year.

Criteria

Our primary considerations are:

- · Attitude and a desire to work
- Independence and previous work or volunteer experience
- Literacy level and reading comprehension

How much will it cost?

- Tuition, per certificate: \$3,500*
- Textbooks and supplies: \$300*
