


Fall-Winter **Full-time Gender Distribution**




Fall-Winter Part-time Gender Distribution




Total Fall-Winter Gender Distribution




Full-time Age Distribution




AGE DISTRIBUTION SEMESTERIZED VOCATIONAL




GENDER DISTRIBUTION SEMESTERIZED VOCATIONAL


PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION BY MAJOR PROGRAM AREA
