




Summer 04 - Winter 05 Full-time Gender
Distribution




Total Summer 04 - Winter 05 Gender Distribution




Academic Year Level Distribution 04-05




Summer 04 - Winter 05 Part-time Gender Distribution






Summer 04 - Winter 05 Full-time / Gender Distribution




Summer 04 - Winter 05 Part-time / Gender Distribution




Total Summer 04 - Winter 05 / Gender Distribution




Total Summer 04 - Winter 05 / Age






Summer 04 - Winter 05 Full-time / Gender Distribution




Summer 04 - Winter 05 Part-time / Gender




Total Summer 04 - Winter 05 Gender






Total Summer 04 - Winter 05 Trades Vocational Gender Distribution






Total Summer 04 - Winter 05 Gender

Average Age as of Jan 01/2005 for Continuing Studies Students






Summer 04 - Winter 05 Gender Distribution




Total Age Distribution Summer 04 - Winter 05 25-29



Average Age as of Jan 1/2005 for **Unclassified Students**









Distribution of First Nations Students by Gender and by Program Area*






Gender Distribution by Degree: 2004-2005

Credentials Awarded at UCC: 1995 to 2005*








