Backwards Design Workshop May 25, 10:30-11:30 a.m. (Online)









Have you been tasked with creating a new course for the coming terms? Or have you wanted to make adjustments to a course that you are already teaching? What if your learners remembered the course and its learning pathways years after they took it?

Sometimes changing the way you think about designing instruction can help you and your learners reach the goals you have set for the course. Backward Design (BD) is a workshop to look at an alternative way to think about designing a course. Join Dr. Diane Janes for this one hour virtual workshop as we examine the differences in traditional design thinking, Backward Design thinking, and walk through the stages that make up BD. Indigenous Land Based Teaching and Learning (FULL) May 30-June 1, Clearwater, BC

Join Laura Grizzlypaws and local knowledge keepers in Clearwater to be introduced to or deepen your understanding of the practices of Indigenous land-based learning. The three-day/ two-night workshop will be

Join CELT for a three-day SoTL research retreat where you and faculty colleagues from around campus will work to find



out how SoTL fits into your classroom and discipline - from forming a research question - to examining the literature - to choosing methods - to ethics - to partnering with student researchers - to funding your research.
