Indigenous Student Mobility and Exchange

- The Indigenous Education Office received \$500,000 in Global Skills Opportunity grant funding to facilitate Indigenous student mobility
- TRU World secured over \$900,000 in GSO funding through Universities Canada and Colleges and Institutes Canada. These funds are being allocated to diverse projects prioritizing indigenous and under-represented students:
- TRU World has committed to sending 49 indigenous students abroad through various field schools and field trips, with 15 already benefiting from the initiative. Locations include Spain, Japan, Nepal, Italy, Belize and Thailand.
- <u>2019 Exchange with University of Tasmania</u>
- TRU partners with University of Canterbury NZ for Indigenous led programming
- A cultural exchange planned for May to ITESO in Guadalajara, Mexico. An elder and a TRU staff member will accompany the group for this 2 -week cultural exchange.
- Upcoming TULO project: Gaglardi School of Business sending students to New Zealand in March
