This network, called Ombaashi, an Ojibwe word meaning to soar upwards or to be lifted by the wind, this network of Indigenous research experts and mentors extends through Canada, Australia, Fiji, Mexico, Nicaragua, Norway, New Zealand, Samoa, Tonga and the United States.

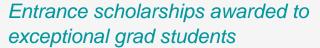

### Tri-agency News

#### CIHR Project Grant Updates

Several changes to the Fall 2017 Project Grant competition. For this competition, the applications will be reviewed by face-to-face panels, with no online or other prior evaluations, applicants will be asked to choose the panel most relevant to their research, and reviewers will be recruited for a single panel. More information about these changes can be found on the CIHR website.

#### SSHRC Insight Grants

Application deadline: Oct. 16, 2017

SSHRC will offer applicants the choice of two streams within the IG funding opportunity. The two stream approach is intended to respond to the concerns raised by both researchers and peer reviewers, namely that there is a perceived bias encouraging larger and longer grants and that there are no options for established scholars seeking smaller grants to support ongoing research. These changes will be implemented for the 2017 IG competition.

- Stream A (duration of 2-5 years) will be for requests ranging from \$7,000 to \$100,000
- Stream B (duration of 2-5 years) will be for requests ranging from \$100,000 to \$400,000

Those researchers who applied unsuccessfully for an Insight Development Grant in the 2017 competition may apply for Stream A or B in the 2017 IG competition.

#### NSERC Discovery Grant

Deadline: Aug. 1 (Notice of Intent); Nov. 1 (full application)

The Discovery Grants Program supports ongoing programs of research with long-term goals. These grants recognize the creativity and innovation that are at the heart of all research advances.

#### **NSERC Connect Grants**

Award value: Up to \$5,000 for up to three months (level 1); from \$1,000 - \$5,000 for up to 1 year (level 2); up to \$25,000 for up to one year (level 3)

Variable deadlines

Connect grants provide targeted financial support to encourage post-secondary researchers at universities and/or colleges to connect with industry and other knowledge end-user communities in order to form new partnerships. Connect Grant recipients can be individuals at either an NSERC-eligible institution or a not-for-profit, non-government organization (including an industry association).

#### Heart & Stroke Foundation: Grants-in-Aid

Deadline: Aug. 30

Award Value: \$300,000 over 3 years

This program provides operating funds to support important, pertinent, novel research in the areas of heart disease and stroke. The funding promotes research discovery, exploration and innovation across all health research themes. Knowledge gained from scientific findings, contributes to the cardiovascular and cerebrovascular health of Canadians through prevention, treatment and recovery. Research is supported in basic biomedical, clinical, health services and systems, social, cultural and environmental population health.

#### NEW! SSHRC Partnership Engage Grants

Deadline: Sept. 15, 2017

Award Value: Between \$7,000-\$25,000

SSHRC Partnership Engage Grants are designed for a researcher and a single partner organization from the not-for-profit, public or private sector. The PEG will be offered four times per year.

### CIHR Project Grant

Deadline: Sept. 15, 2017 Award value: varies

The Project Grant program is designed to capture ideas with the greatest potential for

important advances in fundamental or applied health-related knowledge, the health care system, and/or health outcomes, by supporting projects with a specific purpose and a defined endpoint.

#### NSERC Idea to Innovation Grants

Deadline: Oct. 2, 2017 Award value: \$125,000

The I2I accelerates the pre-competative development of promising technology originating from the university and college sector and promotes its transfer to a new or established Canadian company. The I2I provides funding to college and university faculty members to support research and development projects with recognized technology transfer potential.

#### SSHRC Partnership Development Grant

Deadline: Nov. 1, 2017 (internal); Nov. 30, 2017 (external)

Award value: \$75,000 - \$200,000

Partnership Development Grants provide support over one to three years to teams/partnerships, led by a project director, to:

- develop research and related activities in the social sciences and humanities, including knowledge mobilization and the meaningful involvement of students and new scholars, by fostering new partnerships, including networks, for research and related activities involving existing and/or potential partners; or
- design and test new partnership approaches for research and/or related activities that may result in best practices or models that either can be adapted by others or have the potential to be scaled up to a regional, national or international level.

Partnerships funding is intended for teams working in formal collaboration between postsecondary institutions and/or organizations of various types.

## Funding Opportunities (internal)

#### Community-Driven Research Fund

Deadline: Continuous intake until October 2019, up to 10 awards available Award value: \$2,500. Matching Contributions of up to \$2,500 in cash or in-kind support is required from the community organization

Funds are still available through the Community-Driven Research Fund, which is designed to support research that responds directly to community needs, builds research partnerships with community organizations in the Thompson Nicola Cariboo region, provides opportunities for students to become involved in community-based research, and helps faculty and their community partners become more competitive for external funding.

#### Undergraduate Research Apprenticeship Fund

Competition opens: Sept. 13, 20017, continuous intake

Award value: \$3,000

This award is available to research-engaged faculty members, allowing them to hire an Undergraduate Research Apprentice to assist in the acceleration of their research. The application form will be available when the competition opens. All applications are to be initiated by faculty. Up to 30 awards are available.

#### Ken Lepin Graduate Student Awards

Deadline: Aug. 15, 2017 Award value: \$5,000

The Ken Lepin Graduate Student Awards are available to help students who are entering their first or second year of a full-time graduate program, for those studying on campus or online. The award will be given on the basis of outstanding academic achievement in course work and research, and will take into account leadership activities. Five awards are available.
