	oven and couple of Panini presses – in warming up food there are some	
	cooking smells. Currently there is no ventilation to this area so no way of	
	extracting these smells. Talked to Tom O'Byrne and not much can be done	
	at this time - only suggestion is to bring forward to Ancillary Services and	
	see if they can put in a ventilation hood in this area. Looking a little further	
	into this.

	the DSA. Trying to find an alternative location for this DSA that won't	
	impede on other areas - have located 3-4 potential different locations. Gord	
	sent out email to Science safety committee asking what areas they feel	
	would work best. They will then look at moving this area – would like to	
	do this once so it's important to gather as much information as possible	
	right now. Waiting until end of week and will then look at moving this	
	DSA and getting the proper signage out to inform everyone. If they just

	Accident Investigations	
1	Investigation Report – BC Open Learning	
	Employee is confined to a wheelchair and thereby has limited mobility. On the day of the incident the employee tried to use the automatic door but it did not work. For some reason the automatic door was switched off and thereby the employee was unable to open the door by that means. The employee then proceeded to open the heavy door manually and in maneuvering through the doorway he pulled the muscles in his right shoulder. There is a switch located approximately 12 inches above the inside door button and this switch was turned off. It is unsure who shut it off and why. This switch is located in a very poor location as it allows for easy access to anyone.  Investigation started on October 23, 2014 – pulled muscle – right shoulder Unsafe acts: door switch was turned off Hazardous conditions: defective tools/equipment, automatic doors installed for persons with limited mobility was disengaged Corrective action:  1. Apply signage to not adjust or tamper with the switch 2. Apply warning tape over the switch to reduce the chance of	
	someone inadvertently turning off the switch	
	This is the only door where the mechanisms are in this location – others	
	aren't as accessible.	
2	Investigation Report – House of Learning The employee was throwing garbage into a garbage can that was located under a concrete stairwell. The employee bent over under the stairwell and when she stood up she hit her head on the concrete stairs. Clearance under the stairs is 5'3" (63") Investigation started on November 3, 2014 Unsafe acts: failure to warn/secure, unmarked hazard zone (low area under concrete stairs) Hazardous conditions: inadequate guarding, congestion or restricted actions, restricted height clearance under the stairs in the House of Learning Corrective action:  1. Move garbage can and table away from under the stairs 2. Apply caution tape along the low edge of the stairs to warn of low overhead in the area 3. Look into placing a barrier of some sort around the area under the stairs
