

Tri-agency News

Launch of the renewal of the Tri-Agency Financial Administration Guide

NSERC, CIHR, SSHRC launched the renewal of the Tri-Agency Financial Administration Guide (TAFAG) in September. A large part of the renewal will involve streamlining and simplifying the administration and use of grant funds by creating a principles-based TAFAG in consultation with the community. The vision for this updated guide is to promote

efficiencies, reduce administrative burden, and provide greater flexibility to administering institutions and grant recipients in ensuring the appropriate accountability and use of grant funds. The Agencies expect to have the new principles-based guide in place by late Spring 2018.

NSERC Connect Grants

Award value: Up to \$5,000 for up to three months (level 1); from \$1,000 - \$5,000 for up to 1 year (level 2); up to \$25,000 for up to one year (level 3) Variable deadlines

Connect grants provide targeted financial support to encourage post-secondary researchers at universities and/or colleges to connect with industry and other knowledge end-user communities in order to form new partnerships. Connect Grant recipients can be individuals at either an NSERC-eligible institution or a not-for-profit, non-government organization (including an industry association).

Michael Smith Foundation: Pathway to Patient-Oriented Research (P2P) Awards

Deadline: Oct. 16, 2017 (internal); Oct. 30, 2017 (external)

Value: \$20,000

These awards help BC-based patient-oriented research teams pilot and test the feasibility of their project, to make their future grant applications stronger.

WERF/Pentair: Evaluating Economic & Environmental Benefits of Water Reuse for Agriculture

Deadline: Oct. 18, 2017 Value: Up to \$90,000

The objective of this fund is to provide documentation and characterization of economic and environmental benefits and obstacles to utilizing non-traditional water sources for agricultural irrigation.

MSFHR: Convening and Collaborating (C2)

Deadline: Oct. 18, 2017 (internal); Oct. 27, 2017 (external)

Value: \$15,000

These awards support teams of health researchers and research users plan and carry out collaborative activities such as consultations, public engagement or co-development of research methodology.

NSERC Research Tools and Instruments Grant

Value: \$7,000 - \$150,000

RTI grants assist in the purchase of research equipment to support NSERC-funded

research.

NSERC Discovery Grant

The Discovery Grants Program supports ongoing programs of research with long-term goals. These grants recognize the creativity and innovation that are at the heart of all research advances.

Wildlife Habitat of Canada - Call for Proposals

Deadline: Nov. 1, 2017

Value: Varies

WHC primarily supports projects involving the participation of multiple partners that: Support the priority conservation activities under the North American Waterfowl Management Plan (NAWMP), including the human dimensions goal; support regional and local habitat projects of importance to other migratory game birds; support the priority conservation and management activities under the Newfoundland and Labrador Murre Conservation Fund.

CIHR Operating Grant: Opioid Crisis Knowledge Synthesis

Deadline: Nov. 21, 2017 (internal); Dec. 5, 2017 (external)

Value: \$110,000 for up to six months

Webinar: Oct. 17, 2017 from 1:30 - 3:30 pm, EST

This funding opportunity will support expedited knowledge synthesis grants to rapidly inform policies on opioids related to one or more pillars of the Canadian Drugs and Substances Strategy (i.e. prevention, treatment, harm reduction and enforcement).

SSHRC Partnership Development Grant

Deadline: Nov. 1, 2017 (internal); Nov. 30, 2017 (external)

Value: \$75,000 - \$200,000

Partnership Development Grants provide support over one to three years to teams/partnerships, led by a project director, to:

- develop research and related activities in the social sciences and humanities, including knowledge mobilization and the meaningful involvement of students and new scholars, by fostering new partnerships, including networks, for research and related activities involving existing and/or potential partners; or
- design and test new partnership approaches for research and/or related activities that may result in best practices or models that either can be adapted by others or have the potential to be scaled up to a regional, national or international level.

Partnerships funding is intended for teams working in formal collaboration between postsecondary institutions and/or organizations of various types.

Vancouver Foundation Field of Interest - Education & Training

Deadline: Nov. 3, 2017 Value: Up to \$75,000

Funding will prioritise projects that work to ensure that children are socially and emotionally prepared to start school and to prepare young people to transition through and out of the education system.

CIHR Catalyst: Indigenous Approaches to Wellness Research

Deadline: Oct. 9, 2017 (internal); Oct. 17, 2017 (external)

Value: Up to \$150,000

This grant provides seed money to support research activities related to Indigenous approaches to wellness which represent the first steps towards the pursuit of more comprehensive funding opportunities (e.g., operating grants). This funding opportunity will fund researchers who, in collaboration with the Indigenous community, will develop, evaluate, and build on existing tools and methods to better incorporate Indigenous concepts of wellness in health research designs.

Funding Opportunities (internal)

Research Training Recognition Fund

Deadline: Oct. 13

The RTRF reflects TRU's ongoing commitment to student research training. Regular faculty holding multi-year Tri-Agency research grants are eligible to receive a reallocation of workload to facilitate their direct involvement in the enhanced research training of undergraduate and graduate students.

Community-Driven Research Fund

Deadline: Continuous intake until October 2019, up to 10 awards available

Value: \$2,500. Matching Contributions of up to \$2,500 in cash or in-kind support is required from the community organization

Funds are still available through the Community-Driven Research Fund, which is designed to support research that responds directly to community needs, builds research partnerships with community organizations in the Thompson Nicola Cariboo region, provides opportunities for students to become involved in community-based research, and helps faculty and their community partners become more competitive for external funding.
