**Application process:** PG is a two stage application process, involving Letter of Intent (Stage 1) and a formal application by invitation (Stage 2). Successful applicants from Stage 1 will be offered a grant worth up to \$20,000 to help prepare formal application for Stage 2.

## Difference between Partnership Development Grants (PDG) and PG:

- Both provide support for new and/or existing formal partnerships.
- PDGs are awarded to individuals, to design and test new partnership approaches for research and/or related activities. One-stage application process.

• PGs are awarded to institutions, to support initiatives that advance research and/or knowledge mobilization activities. A two-stage application process: Stage 1—Letter of Intent; and Stage 2—Formal Application. Only those proposals awarded a Letter of Intent grant (valued at \$20,000) will be eligible to submit a Formal Application.
