Completion of a 4 year recognized bachelor's degree from an accredited institution in any field and the successful completion of the following prerequisites:

Academic standing of a **minimum B+ (76%) average** in ALL senior level courses (3000 and 4000 level). Competitive GPA for the program is approximately 84%.

70 volunteer hours of work or interactive voluntary work experience with individuals with disabilities A minimum of 70 hours of volunteer or paid work which includes direct contact involving interacting with persons with cognitive, emotional or physical disabilities at no more than two facilities.

English Competency- refer to website for specifics to satisfy this requirement.

Residency - Preference for admission is given to residents of British Columbia.

Interview – applicants who meet the above minimum requirements are eligible for interview consideration (verbal communication skill, maturity and personal suitability). The interview will comprise of a verbal interview. Fulfilment of the minimum requirements, however, does not guarantee an interview. Selection of interview candidates is based on the academic standing in the senior level courses. Refer to website for more information.
