

The Master of Physical Therapy degree, offered at The University of British Columbia, provides the professional education necessary to obtain a licence to practice physical therapy. Admission to MPT is offered on a competitive basis (**80 seats**/ an additional 8 seats for International students). The full-time MPT program is 26 months.

Prospective applicants must refer to the UBC website for a complete list of the educational and general admission requirements.

In addition to meeting the admission requirements of the Faculty of Graduate Studies at UBC, applicants must have the following:

1. Completion of a 4-year recognized bachelor's degree (120 credits) in any field and the successful completion of the stated prerequisites. Offered at TRU, are the following pre-requisite equivalencies:

2. Academic Requirements:

- Academic standing of a minimum B+ (76%) average in senior level courses (3000 and 4000 level).
- Academic Standing of a B minimum (72%) in each prerequisite course is required.

3. 70 volunteer hours or work experience with people with disabilities.

A minimum of 70 hours of volunteer or paid work, which includes, direct contact involving interacting with persons with cognitive, emotional or physical disabilities at no more than two facilities.

4. English Competency

5. Residency.

6. Multiple Mini Interviews – Applicants who meet the above minimum requirements are eligible for interview consideration. The purpose of the interview is to ascertain the applicant's verbal communication skills, maturity level and personal suitability to the program and profession. Annually approximately 300-400 people apply for admissions into the MPT program and approximately half will be offered an opportunity to interview. Fulfillment of the minimum requirements does not guarantee an interview. Selection of interview candidates is based on the GPA calculation.
