TRU Act

- Enacted specifically for TRU in 2005 after extensive consultation with senior administration.
- Bi-cameral governance Board is not "senior" to Senate.
- Also have Planning Council for Open Learning:
 - \circ tri-cameral governance.
- In administration, we look at this Act almost every day and carry it with us.





- This is the second tier of governance rules for the Senate.
- The Bylaws were adopted by Senate in 2006 and are revised from time to time.
- The Bylaws are 11 pages long and deal with subjects including: Conflict of Interest, Officers, Duties of Senators, Quorum, etc.
- The Bylaws provide that Robert's Rules of Order apply to Senate meetings.



Bylaws (cont'd)

> Duties required of Senate members include:

- Act in what the Senate member considers to be the best interest of the University even if that conflicts with the wishes of any group that elected the member;
- Consult with any group the member may belong to and communicate to such group the matters dealt with at the Senate;
- Elected senators cannot miss more than 3 consecutive ordinary meetings of senate without a resolution from senate
- Confidentiality



Bylaws (cont'd)

Conflict of Duty and Interest:

- 3 pages in Bylaws.
- Senators must not place themselves in a position where there is a conflict, or a perceived conflict, between their duties to the University and their personal interest (including family and close friends).
- Key is to stay alert to any situation that might give rise to a perceived conflict of interest.
- Once a concern is identified should disclose to the Senate Chair who can get legal advice if needed.



Policies

- TRU has approximately 100 policies
- 41 of these policies are Senate policies;
- Significant Senate policies include:
 - Student Academic Integrity
 - Program Review
 - \circ Examinations
 - Grading Systems
 - Integrity in Research and Scholarship
 - Student Academic Appeals



Senate Committees

Senate has 13 committees, with approved terms of reference, reporting to Senate:
