Any sexual act or act targeting an individual's sexuality, gender identity or gender expression without that individual's Consent.



Can be physical or psychological



Can be threatened, attempted, or committed

Sexualized Violence: On campus

266

students experienced sexualized penetration (vaginal, anal, oral) without their consent

359

students experienced someone having sex with them without consent when drinking alcohol

453

students experienced an intimate (coupled / partnered) relationship that was: Physically abusive (e.g., kicked, slapped, punched)

469

students experienced in an intimate relationship that was sexually abusive

594

students experienced an attempted sexualized penetration (vaginal, anal, oral) without their consent

1,156

students experienced stalking

1,921

students experienced sexualized touching without their consent

2,000

students experienced an intimate relationship that was emotionally abusive
