Medical Insurance

MEDICAL INSURANCE IS MANDATORY IN CANADA AT ALL TIMES

TRU automatically enrolls all new students with guard.me insurance

students with guard.me insurance for their first 90 days in Canada. Students can opt out of guard.me coverage if they already have medical insurance that covers them up to a minimum \$500,000 in medical expenses.

Exchange students must complete the opt-out form on **guard.me/tru** website and upload their insurance in English immediately.

Medical Services Plan (MSP) Insurance

Three months after entering British Columbia, students are eligible to enrol in the BC Medical Services Plan (MSP).



Under the Medicare Protection Act, enrolment with the Medical Services Plan (MSP) is mandatory for all eligible residents and their dependents. ISAs will help new students to complete an application for MSP insurance during orientation.

EXTENDED HEALTH AND DENTAL INSURANCE (TRU STUDENT UNION)

The following students have to opt in if they want coverage under the TRUSU Health and Dental Plan:



- · Winter semester students
- Summer semester students
- Exchange and visiting students
- Students who previously opted out
- · Dependents of the above

If a student opts in to the TRUSU Health and Dental Plan, he or she is NOT automatically enrolled every year and will need to opt in manually again the following year to maintain his or her coverage.

To opt in for the TRUSU Health and Dental program, students must go to the Members Services desk in the Students' Union Building (in the Campus Activity Centre). A health and dental opt-in form must be completed and a fee paid.
