

Bachelor of Education (Elementary)

Become a teacher who inspires learning.

The Bachelor of Education (BEd) (Elementary) program prepares and qualifies you to teach grades K-12 in the BC school curriculum and is accredited by the BC Ministry of Education.

As a graduate of this two-year interdisciplinary degree program, you qualify for a professional teaching certificate issued by the BC Ministry of Education, Teacher Regulation Branch (TRB). Your BEd and TRB certification qualify you to teach Kindergarten to grade 12 in many different formal or informal instructional settings in BC, across Canada and internationally.

You can apply to the BEd (Elementary) program as a teacher candidate if you have:

• Completed a minimum of 90 credits towards a degree in a teachable area such as the liberal, fine or performing arts, mathematics, sciences or physical education.

TRU BEd graduates are highly employable and are working as:

- Elementary, middle and secondary teachers in the K-12 public and private sectors
- Teachers on call

BEd graduates can also continue their studies through the TRU Master of Education (MEd) degree.
