OUR WALKABLE CAMPUS

We are undertaking several construction efforts to make our campus more inviting, beautiful, and welcoming for pedestrians. This includes closing a road and creating a new pedestrian corridor between the Chappell Family Building for Nursing and Population Health and the Ken Lepin Science and Health Sciences Building. The goal is to have a common walkway that connects all of campus and supports pedestrian safety.
