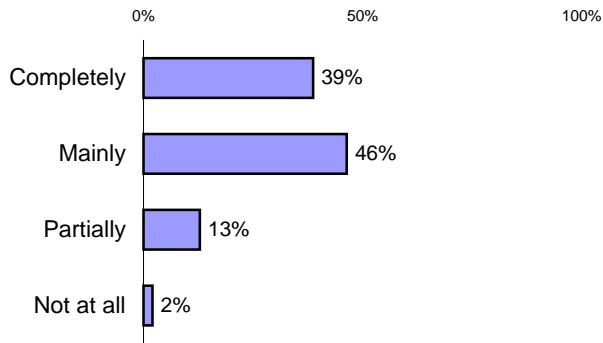

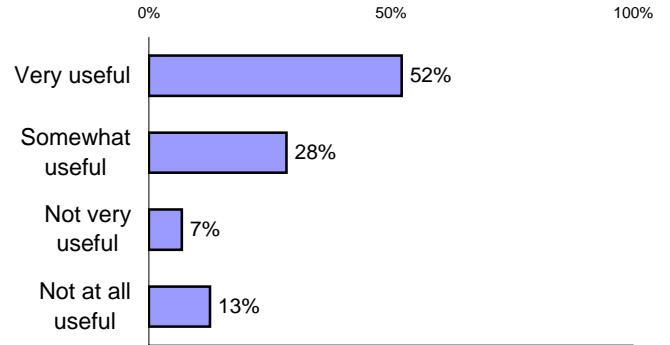
Student Satisfaction and Usefulness of Training
