

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

• English requirements for direct entry from countries where English is not the first official language:

IELTS 7.0, no bands below 6.5 or equivalent for MAHRSJ, MBA, MEEM, MScEEM and MN

IELTS 6.5, no bands below 6.0 or equivalent for all other programs

WINTER (Jan-Apr): October 1

SUMMER (May-Aug): February 1

FALL (Sept-Dec): May 1

2» Apply

Apply online at **truworld.ca/apply**. A non-refundable application fee of CDN 100.00 will be required to complete your application.

3>> Paperwork

Upload all required documents and transcripts.

4» Acceptance


If you are successful, you will receive a conditional acceptance letter. This process normally takes one week.

5» Commitment

Make your full commitment fee payment and arrange to have your official transcripts couriered or emailed by your institution to International Admissions.

You will receive a final acceptance letter that you can use to apply for a student visa or study permit.

NEXT STEPS



TRU's Kamloops and Williams Lake campuses are located on the traditional territory of the Secwepemc peoples, in British Columbia's southern interior. In Kamloops (from the Secwepemc word for "meeting of the waters"), the main campus overlooks the junction of the North Thompson and South Thompson rivers, from which the university gets its name.
