Scholarship of Teaching and Learning

Applications to join the new 2024 SoTL Scholars Development and Grant Program are now being accepted! Relevant for faculty of all scholarly experience levels, participants will learn how to engage (or engage more intentionally) in the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning within and beyond TRU. CELT will support faculty scholars over 16 months through mentorship, on-campus retreats, and a \$2500 grant, to conduct a SoTL project from design through analysis and into dissemination.
