CAREERS FOR GRADUATES

Anthropology offers many careers in both the public and private sectors. Non-governmental organizations, such as international health organizations and development banks employ anthropologists to help design and implement a wide variety of programs. Governmental organizations use anthropologists in planning, research and managerial capacities. Cultural Resource Management (CRM) has been a growth occupation with provincial and federal mandates to assess cultural resources affected by private development and government-funded projects. Forensic anthropologists, not only work with police departments to help identify mysterious or unknown remains but work in university and museum settings. A corporate anthropologist working in market research might conduct targeted focus groups to examine consumer preference patterns not readily apparent through statistical or survey methods.
