- 1. B.C. Grade 12 or mature student status
- 2. C+ in either Foundations Math 12 or pre-Calculus Math 12 or TRU Math 0610 or equivalent
- 3. English 12/English 12 First Peoples with a minimum of 73% (with the government exam within the last 5 years); or equivalent (See English 1100 prerequisite on page 2)

NOTE: Students may commence their studies while they upgrade their English and Mathematics

- Completion of the first and second year requirements (60 credits), with a minimum 2.0 GPA.
