## Course Equivalencies

## Transfer Credit Policy

- Complete at least 120 credits with a minimum of 60 credits as TRU credit. Students must also complete a minimum of 36 business credits as define by AACSB as TRU credit. More than 120 credits may have to be taken to meet these requirements.
- Transfer credit will be determined on a course-by-course basis. Equivalent courses taken at approved two-year colleges will be awarded credit for lower level courses only. Upper level credit will be granted if a course is taken at an acceptable university. Normally, the course must be 80 percent equivalent to receive credit.
- Students must have a grade of C- or higher to receive transfer credit - non-graded (Pass/Fail, Complete) or university preparation credits will not be accepted. Transferred courses are awarded credit only and are not included in the CGPA.
- Other courses not listed in this chart may be assessed for equivalency.
