DIRECTOR'S REPORT	Most issues were covered in the discussion of the AASHE STARS report, but Jim also reported that almost 19,000 tubular LED bulbs were installed all over the campus to replace the more energy intensive traditional fluorescent tubular bulbs. Doing so will result in an estimated \$90,000/year savings (1 million kw/hrs per year).
