ECON 4720-3 Sustainable Economic Development (3,0,0)

Calendar Description

Students examine theories and issues, internal and external challenges, and alternative policy options relating to sustainable economic development. Topics include a comparative analysis of the leading theories of economic growth, development, and sustainability; lack of economic growth, poverty, and income distribution; consequences of population growth and technological change; employment and migration, human capital, agriculture, and rural development; international trade and commercial policy, foreign investment, and aid; an d global integration, economic transition, and environmental degradation.

- 2. Describe appropriate measures or indicators of development.

- 8. Appraise economic transition and environmental degradation.
- 9. Relate the effect of globalization on sustainable economic development.
