Sustainability as the theme for the upcoming February 22 TRU In-

<u>Service Day.</u> Jim reported that the broad parameters of the agenda are set. Alex Stephan (futurist) is the key-note speaker. - There was discussion that the 'Best Before' designation on stickers is confusing for consumers, since many think you should not/cannot eat food past this date. In fact, this date signifies peak freshness. Perhaps the sticker should read 'Peak Freshness'.
- January 25 the documentary Just Eat It will show at TRU as part of the Films For Change series. It's about food waste in BC and Canada.
- Food Trucks will soon be coming to campus. James was asked to talk to Jim about discussing composting options with the truck owners.
