**Course Code:** **ECON 3990: Global Economic and Environmental Issues**

**Credit Value:** 3 TRU Credits

**Prerequisites:** **Permission of Faculty (L. Lake). Open to students from all programs. Must be complete minimum 30 credits with 2.70 minimum GPA.**

**Participants:** A maximum of 12 students will be admitted. Early submission of applications is recommended. Deadline for application: **Thursday December 5, 2019.**

**Program Fee:** \$1500.00. TRU will apply a \$1000 Field School Award to all admitted students once all documents are provided. Balance due from student participants is \$500, plus airfare.

**Fees Include:** Included costs: accommodation (3-4/room), in country transportation, three team dinners, and program related guided excursions. Fee paid **excludes** the cost for flight to Malaga from Kamloops, travel insurance (required), personal spending money and meals not included on the itinerary.

**Deposit:** A \$250 deposit must be deposited to your tuition account for the Field School. Ask the cashier to deposit to **CAVS**. The balance due (\$250) due by February 7, 2020.

**Application Deadline:** Thursday December 5, 2019 or when all 12 positions are filled.
