## **Study Space on Kamloops Campus**

In response to a Student Engagement Committee of Senate Motion: Mar. 26, 2014

This report was prepared in response to a request in the form of a motion from the Student Engagement Committee of Senate on March 26, 2014:

On motion duly made and adopted, it was RESOLVED to request from Institutional Planning and Analysis a report on campus study space to include the following:

- Capacity
  - Purpose/Privacy: Number of spaces by category/character of use –
     i.e. group, individual, or mixed use; level of acoustic and visual separation
  - o Location: Number of spaces by building
  - o Availability and Access: Number of hours per day regularly and during exam period
- Usage
- Student Survey
  - o Self---reported use
  - o Satisfaction with specific spaces at TRU
  - o Self---identified study space needs

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#### A. Capacity

# Purpose/Privacy: Number of spaces by category/character of use – i.e. group, individual, or mixed use; level of acoustic and visual separation

The purposes of space are described in the TRU Facilities Information System (FIS) as of the last refresh in October 2013. Figure 1 summarizes the number of rooms and total area by several FIS space types and room descriptions relating to study space. The area of space is included; room capacity (number of seats) is available for classrooms only. See C. Appendix 1 for detailed room information. Data on the level of acoustic and visual separation of these spaces are not available.

#### **Location: Number of spaces by building**

Figure 1 summarizes the number of rooms by the room categories and descriptions in the FIS, by building. This list is not exhaustive, as it only includes rooms that are identified as study space in the FIS. It does not include rooms that are identified as mixed space, eating space, etc.

#### Satisfaction with Specific Spaces at TRU

TRU administers several student surveys that include questions about study space. The following results are summarized from these surveys.

#### Canadian University Survey Consortium

The Canadian University Consortium surveys ask students to indicate how satisfied they are with many aspects of their university, including library, study, and social and informal space. In the most recent 2013 survey, first year TRU students tended to be more satisfied than students in comparable universities as well as more satisfied than the entire Canadian survey cohort (Figure 2).

In 2012, TRU graduating students were slightly less satisfied with library facilities than students in the comparison groups (Figure 3).

**2011:** Qualitative analysis of comments showed a theme of 'lack of study space' among five themes.

**2012:** Qualitative analysis showed a theme of 'lack of quiet study space' among three themes.
